THE AWAY END

Barnstaple Town

Founded in 1904 as Pilton Yeo Vale, the club entered the North Devon league. They were founder members along with Ilfracombe, South Molton, Pilton Social Barnstaple Y.M.C.A, Braunton and Bideford.

Their first ever league match was on 1st October 1904 when they played Ilfracombe at Pilton Park and were defeated 4-2. The club changed its name to Barnstaple Town at the end of the season and continued in the North Devon League, Devon & Exeter League and then the South Western League.

When the Western League was reformed after the Second World War, Barnstaple Town entered two teams, one in division 2 and a reserve side in division 3. The early 1950's were one of the club's most successful times under the management of Arthur Coles. In 1953, Barnstaple won the Western league First Division Championship but only after a nail biting climax to the season with everything depending on the results of matches being played on the final day of the League Season.

On that day, Barnstaple Town beat Dorchester Town 6-1 and their challengers for the title, Street won 2-1 at Wells City. That left the sides level on points and when the goal average was calculated Street had 2.07 and incredibly Barnstaple had 2.08. The club also beat Plymouth Argyle in the final of the Devon Pro' Cup at Home Park that season, but sadly Coles moved on to Weymouth and the club never had quite the same success again.

Cameron Buchanan, the former Wolves and Bournemouth player, local lads Fred Smale and Ray Smith, Bill Johnson formerly of Grimsby Town, Noel Peyton, the ex

Leeds United and Eire International, John Hancock formerly with Exeter City and ex Barnsley and Doncaster Rovers player Lol Chappell all tried to revive Barnstaple's fortunes from the manager's seat but with no great success.

Player Manager Charlie Sells, who had been with Exeter City, built up the club in the 1970's followed by the former Andover keeper Trevor Morris and then Brian Perks.

Perks left Mill Road for Bideford during the season of 1979/80 and under the guidance of joint managers Brian Hill and Dave Baglow, Barum went on to win the Western League Championship for the second time, winning by one point from AFC Bournemouth Reserves.

That title went virtually unnoticed as there was a printer's strike at the time and no newspapers were printed.

Richard Gray took over the following season and brought some success to the club although they never won the title.

A couple of seasons later he left after a disagreement with the club, and after a succession of managers Town lost their Premier status in 1989/90. Brian Hill was again appointed manager to put Town back in the Premier Division and after 3 seasons in the wilderness won the First Division Championship in 1993/94 in fine style scoring more goals and recording more points than ever before. Jeff Evans was appointed manager in 2002 and along with his assistant Peter Buckingham guided the club to the final of The Devon Bowl where they were narrowly beaten by Tiverton Town.

The following season Peter Buckingham took over as sole manager and Barum finished in seventh place in the league, their highest finish for many a season.

During the 2008/09 season Owen Pickard took over the manager's seat for his first taste of management and was able to save the club from what looked like certain relegation at the Christmas period of the season.

Barnstaple remained in the Premier League until the end of the 2012/13 season when they were relegated to Western League Division One - the first time in their history that they had finished at the bottom of their division.

The gloom surrounding Mill Road was to be short lived as in the December of 2013 the club appointed the joint management team of Barry Yeo and Karl Baggaley. Building a squad where, on occasions, all eleven players on the field were born in Barnstaple - surely a record that not many teams at any level of football would be able to equal - the managers turned the 2013/14 season around and finished a creditable 3rd. In their first full season in charge, 2014/15, the club returned to the Western League Premier Division by winning the First Division title. for the 3rd time in its history.

Their total of 100 points, 128 goals scored and a goal difference of 101 were among 15 club records set during the year, in addition to reaching the final of the Les Phillips Cup for the second time. 2015/16 was to be equally successful. After an average start the team went on two long unbeaten runs which saw them finish as runners up in the Premier Division, missing out on back to back titles by just 3 points, but securing the coveted prize of promotion to the Southern League Division One South & West.

This would see them playing at the highest level in the club's history - the biggest step the club had taken since joining the Western League in 1948.

At the end of 2016/17, having secured Southern League football for a second season with a 17th place finish, the management duo stood down and as is often the case in these situations, most of the players also left for challenges elsewhere.

Since then, the club has found life hard in the Southern League.

Only a combination of other club's misfortunes and a global pandemic have saved the club from relegation on three occasions.

Following last week's Emirates FA Cup exit at the hands of Lymington Town, manager, Dean Edwards left the club and his Assistant Kevin Darch was appointed as caretaker-manager.

He made a great start overseeing a superb victory over Plymouth Parkway in the Southern League Challenge Cup and will be in caretaker charge this evening.

MEET THE OPPO

Barnstaple Town

● ADAM SEEDHOUSE-EVANS -

Goalkeeper who made his debut in the last match played in the 2019/2020 season pulling off a man of the match performance in a 0-0 home draw with Sholing FC. Joined from local side Cullompton Rangers, Adam spent time at the Torquay United Academy, the Devon Under 18s representative side and FC United of Manchester Under 21s.

● **BRIAN LEVIEN** - Joined the club last season from Torridgeside. Began as a progressive midfielder but more recently has been seen in a right wing back role. A tenacious player who always give his all.

● **SADDAM BELLO** - 'Now in his third season 'Tornado' has topped the goalscoring charts for two seasons in a row. Scored nine goals in season 2019/2020. His previous clubs include St. Blazey, St. Austell, Newquay and Porthleven AFC. The fan favourite has also represented Nigeria at Under 17 level.

● **JACOB EVANS** - Attacking midfielder Jacob Evans made a number of promising appearances for Torquay

United first-team during United's warm-up matches last July 2019, and continued to display his potential in both youth and reserve matches throughout the course of 2019/20 campaign, as well as receiving international recognition in November, after being called up to represent the England Colleges National Team. Joined Barum during the summer and has figured regularly in the first team since.

● **HARRY BAMFORTH** - Like Jacob Evans, joined Barum during the summer from Torquay United. Played in a number of first team friendlies for the Gulls ahead of the 20/21 season and since joining Barnstaple has been a regular on the first team scene.

● **NATHANIEL HAWKINS** - Another youngster who began his career at Torquay United and moved to Mill Road during the summer. Has been made club captain and scored the winning penalty in Barum's dramatic penalty shoot-out victory over Plymouth Parkway recently in the Southern League Challenge Cup.

● **EUAN WASHBROOK** - 20-year-old defender who has previously played for Elmore FC. Began with Barum on the bench against Lymington Town in the opening game of the 21-22 season. Made his first appearance on the pitch as a second half substitute in the home match against Melksham Town.

● **LUIS EDMONDSON** - Defender and product of the Torquay United youth system, Luis joined Barnstaple at the beginning of this season. Played for Tavistock AFC in the Western Premier when released by the Gulls.

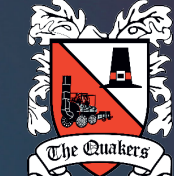
● **RHYS THOMAS** - 'Rhys is a battling midfielder who also arrived at Mill Road at the start of this season. He made his debut in the FA Cup defeat of Bideford in August.

● **MIKE HUMPHRIES** - With 71 appearances, Mike has by far played more games for Town than anyone in the current squad. He made his debut

in a 3-1 loss at AFC Totton under manager Richard Pears back on the 12th August 2017. A tough tackler, Mike is at home playing in defence or midfield hoping to add to the 3 goals he has scored for the club.

● **KEVIN DARCH CARETAKER MANAGER** - Takes over the managerial hot-seat from the recently departed Dean Edwards, Darchie has a long association with his hometown club and was also appointed Vice-Chairman in February 2020. Previous to that he represented the club as a player and jointly managed the first team in 2017/2018. Kevin was also a part of the Exeter City youth set-up back in the early nineties and can still be seen swinging in corner at the occasional Barum reserve team games. Won his first game in charge as caretaker-manager when he saw his side beat Plymouth Parkway 4-3 on penalties after a thrilling 3-3 draw.

The Peacocks made it three Southern League games unbeaten after sharing the spoils in Hertfordshire, but they would undoubtedly have aspired for more at kick-off with the hosts lying at the bottom of the table. However Town never really got any kind of momentum going during the match despite missing a couple of good chances while Kings Langley also had moments of their own and ultimately deserved their point.

A lovely warm autumnal afternoon saw little of note in the opening period apart from Harry Crawford's shot veering wide of the target after 10 minutes. Taunton's first opportunity came when Ollie Chamberlain was brought down on the right and Kings' keeper Jack Berman parried the free kick from Lee Lucas onto the roof of the net. Alfie

Williams dragged a shot wide from distance for the home side before another Lucas free kick was played square to Dan Sullivan and his shot was backheeled by Nick Grimes to Berman. This set the tone for the remainder of the half with neither side gaining any ascendancy.

Kyle Connolly linked with Arel Amu to get clear but saw his effort blocked by Jake Wannell and Connolly again found space on the left to cross to the unmarked Amu who could only direct his header over the bar. A break from the hosts then saw Amu feed Roddy Collins whose shot was blocked by Peacocks keeper Will Buse as Kings enjoyed a decent spell before Town responded.

Chamberlain sliced a volley straight to Berman and Zac Smith's cross fell to Jared Lewington who fired wide before a Peacocks break should have yielded better on 36 minutes when Sullivan found Lewington inside who only succeeded in firing straight at Berman with the whole target on offer. The lack of effectiveness in front of goal continued when Collins fired narrowly past the post for the home side after a deep cross from Louis-Michael Yamfam and Alfie Williams also saw a strike travel wide while Gethyn Hill's header struck the crossbar from a Lucas free kick moments before the interval although the flag was already raised for offside.

Some early pressure from the hosts produced the opening goal of the game five minutes into the second half. There didn't appear too much danger when Kabir Kareem received the ball out wide on the right but a step inside Ross Staley gave him the opening to curl an excellent effort over Buse and into the far corner of the net. Collins had a shot held by Buse who then had to turn wide a curling strike from Williams as the game appeared to be slipping away from the visitors who were finding difficulty in creating anything cohesive. Lucas did flash an effort just wide of the upright before the Peacocks midfielder volleyed inches over the top after Ben Adelsbury had headed Staley's corner back into the middle. Unfortunately, this

proved Lucas' last contribution as his wretched luck with injuries continued, the impact of the shot impacting on his knee.

A trio of successive corners then culminated in Town grabbing the equaliser after 77 minutes, the final one from Smith being met by Wannell whose well-placed header gave Berman no chance. The leveller at last gave the Peacocks an injection of energy as they started to up the ante on the Langley goal. The hosts were always in the picture though, sub Jack Wood moving in from the left to rifle just wide of the far post.

Had Town taken some late opportunities then the outcome could have been different. Toby Holmes broke away on the right to find Chamberlain whose goalbound drive was blocked by a defender, then Hill turned to fire wide from the edge of the box. The best chance though came when Staley's clearance over the top released Hill whose powerful strike from 18 yards was parried by Berman. Bradley Wadkins sliced a shot wide in one last push by Kings before the contest ended all square. A point on the road is not to be sniffed at, yet the Peacocks will be fully aware their performance level will need to be raised much higher if they are to realise their ambitions this season.

THE NON-LEAGUE PAPER

Recreation Ground, Aldershot. Circa 2001-02 season. I had made my way pitchside, waiting for Aldershot Town manager George Borg to emerge back from the tunnel for post-match interviews.

Behind me were two young boys, aged between four and seven I'd say, kicking a football between them on the pitch (don't tell the groundsman, I'm not sure they were allowed).

I knew at the time one of the lads (the younger one I think) to be the son of Stuart Cash, the Aldershot Town assistant manager. He had come along with his Mum to cheer on Dad from the directors' box - I'm guessing his first football memory.

That young boy is now, of course, Matty Cash, Aston Villa's talented young right-back, signed from Nottingham Forest for a cool £16 million just over 12 months ago.

These days, having helped Terry Brown guide AFC Wimbledon into the Football League, Stuart is enjoying the lap of luxury at Premier League grounds up and down the country following his son in a similarly proud show of family loyalty and support.

Matty's plight to the very top got me thinking about players who were brought up in the Non-League way. Yes, there's the Jamie Vardys, Andre Grays and Nick Popes of this world who earned big moves to the top, but how about those with a professional grounding but nurtured off-the-field from a grassroots background.

Indeed, Matty doesn't have to look far to see that he's in good company. His Aston Villa

teammate Tyrone Mings is another taught the Non-League way from his father Adie, who spent six years in charge at Chippenham Town.

It was there where Tyrone was spotted by then Ipswich Town boss Mick McCarthy, who spent £10,000 to bring him to the Championship. The rest, as they say, is history.

Adie later followed his son into the Premier League and is now a scout at Chelsea.

And how about one of the top-flight's newest stars, Crystal Palace's Conor Gallagher? He is the youngest of four brothers with his siblings all having played at Non-League level.

Jake Gallagher, 28, enjoyed a solid career at the likes of Welling United, Aldershot Town and Dorking Wanderers, while twin brother Josh served a number of clubs at Steps 3 and 4, such as Staines Town, Met Police, Leatherhead and Farnborough. Third brother Dan, 24, is currently at Dorking Wanderers. It's groundings such as these which have completely changed the perception of Non-League football from the upper echelons over the years.

No longer is life outside the professional game seen as a poor relation, a kick-and-rush fest played on a quagmire of a pitch, it's now a hotbed of playing and managerial talent with a refreshing purity about it.

And if it hadn't have been for the lure of Non-League and grassroots football then perhaps young Matty Cash might never have got his clear passion for the game.

CYGNET HEALTHCARE STADIUM REGULATIONS

Persons entering this stadium must abide by the Stadium Regulations as printed in the matchday programme and displayed on posters inside the stadium. Failure to do so may result in ejection from the premises, a ban from attending any future events and also be the subject of a football banning order. Admission to and the right remain within the stadium is strictly on condition that any person attending will adhere to the Stadium Regulations as detailed below.

1. All persons must comply with any directions given by a Steward, Club Official or Police Officer.
2. Encroachment onto the playing area, sterile area, or its adjoining parts is prohibited.
3. Climbing on any building, wall, fence or any other structure is prohibited.
4. Persons must not throw any object onto the pitch or within the spectator areas.
5. Persons must not be in possession of, and/or lighting any firework or flare.
6. Chanting or singing of an obscene, indecent, discriminatory or offensive nature is not permitted.
7. Persons must not use obscene, indecent, discriminatory, offensive or threatening language.
8. Persons must not use obscene, indecent, discriminatory, offensive or threatening gestures.
9. Persons must not damage or deface Club and Stadium property.
10. Persons must not damage, deface or obstruct any notice or advertisement.
11. Alcohol must not be brought into the stadium.
12. Persons must not consume alcohol that has not been purchased at Taunton Town FC.
13. Persons must not consume alcohol in any alcohol free designated areas.
14. There will be zero tolerance to alcohol abuse/misuse.
15. There will be zero tolerance to drug possession, use and abuse.
16. Smoking is permitted in the stadium except in areas designated as a No Smoking area.
17. Umbrellas are permitted within the stadium but must not be used if obstructing the view of other spectators.

Spectators must also note the following:

- A) The Club does not accept any responsibility or liability whatsoever for any loss or damage to vehicles or their contents, or any other personal property brought onto the Clubs premises and stadium.
- B) The Club is unable to accept any additional responsibility for minors attending matches beyond those matters covered by the Stadium Regulations.
- C) Photography and use of video including CCTV is in operation at all matches and events and may be used in any of our media channels as well as press releases.
- D) Dogs on a lead are permitted in the Stadium but they remain the sole responsibility of their owner at all times.
