## THE AWAY FND Harley Wintings

Hartley Wintney Football Club was founded in 1897. The club's nickname of 'The Row' comes from Hartley Row, a former hamlet within Hartley Wintney. In the late 1940s and into the 50s, playing in the Basingstoke League, the club was successful despite playing on a farm field with a small wooden shed; this was Causeway Farm adjacent to the golf and cricket clubs. Amongst the villagers who ran the club was its outstanding secretary, Fred Cook. Fred's minutes of meetings covering seasons 1948 to 1964 include the change of the club colours from blue squares to tangerine in July 1956.

The club moved to its present ground in Green Lane - The Memorial Ground - in 1953. A pavilion was erected and the team continued in the Basingstoke League, and later in the Aldershot League.

In 1973, Glynn Howell was appointed Manager. In his six year reign, the team won the Aldershot Senior League three times in succession, and the Aldershot Senior Cup. After several seasons in the Aldershot Senior League, Hartley were admitted to the Combined Counties League (formerly Surrey Senior League).

After the first couple of seasons in the CCL, the club appointed Ian Bedford as First Team Manager. An influx of senior players brought Hartley success. During the 80s these included several notable ex-pros: Mick Travers (1980/81 to 86/87; his clubs included Reading, Portsmouth and Aldershot); Richard Walden (85/86 & 86/87; formerly with Aldershot, Sheffield Wed and Newport County); and Steve Finnieston (85/86 to 87/88; previously with Chelsea, Cardiff and Sheffield Utd).

Within lan's three years in management, the team gained the League Title (1982-83) and Runners Up (81-82), Aldershot Senior Cup Winners (80-81), and George Allen Cup Winners (81-82). They were also Runners Up in the League Cup (82-83)



and Aldershot Senior Cup (81-82).

During this period a new Clubhouse was opened. David Willoughby, then Secretary and Treasurer, and Bill Mitchell, then club Chairman and now President, devoted exceptional hours to this venture.

In 2007-08 under manager Mike Scott, the club gained promotion to the Combined Counties League Premier Division, but 2008-09 ended in relegation by a narrow margin. Under the new management team of Pete Gray and John Condon, the first team rallied, finishing 5th in CCL Div 1 in 2009-10. Coach Louis King then took the reigns as manager, guiding the team to 7th in CCL Div 1 in 2010-11.

Neville Roach took charge for 2011-12, assisted by Mick Wollen and Scott Tarr, and the club secured third in Div 1 to clinch a return to the CCL Premier Division. Hartley also had a fine FA Cup run to the Third Qualifying Round. But the euphoria of promotion was dampened when the coaching staff and almost the entire squad left for Thatcham Town.

Ex-Millwall defender, Dave Tuttle, was given the summer to prepare a new squad for 2012-13. However, a string of poor results led to a second change in management in less than 4 months. 24 year-old ex-Basingstoke Town and Hartley striker, Ben Dillon, was given his first managerial position. With Jason Minton and Joe Lawler, Ben set about rebuilding the squad with Hartley now well and truly set adrift at the bottom of the table. The introduction of a talented group of players restored the spirit around the club. In what became known as the

season of the club's 'Great Escape', the Row's place in the CCL Premier was secured against all the odds after a remarkable second half of the season. To some, this was the turning point that led to the success that followed.

2013-14 season highlight was another good FA Cup run to the 4th Qualifying Round for the first time, losing at home to Daventry Town in front of a crowd of over 1,000. The club finished 7th in the CCL Premier. The new club crest was commissioned. Designer Philippa Bell incorporated elements tracing the village back to the 13th century when known as Hertleye Wynteneye - 'the clearing in the forest where the deer graze by Winta's island' - hence the tree and stag motifs.

2014-15 saw the club finish a comfortable 9th in the CCL Premier, after which Dillon stepped down and Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick were appointed as Joint First Team Managers, with Luke Tuffs as First Team Coach while continuing as Youth Team Manager. It was a very eventful 2015-16. After a memorable FA Cup win

away at Merthyr Town in the Second Qualifying Round, Hartley battled back from 2 down to 2-2 at Conference South Eastbourne Borough, only to be beaten by a goal struck deep in injury time. In the FA Vase, The Row broke a longstanding club record by reaching the 5th Round Proper. In front of a sell-out 1,300 at Green Lane, eventual finalists Hereford proved too strong, but the Row went on to claim the 2015-16 CCL Premier Division title, finishing 10 points clear. Promotion, however, was denied due to ground grading.

Setting out to achieve back-to-back title wins while putting in place substantial ground improvements, the 2016-17 season under co-managers Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick was extraordinary. Propelled by the goals of strike duo Sam Argent and Ross Cook, the Row topped the CCL Premier Division for the entire season, reached the semi-finals of the Hampshire County Cup and the final of the Aldershot Senior Cup, and secured the required ground grading to take their place in the Southern League at Step 4 for the first time. To top off a wonderful season, Luke Tuffs' Youth team won the Hampshire FA Youth Cup against a strong Aldershot Town U18.

Now in Southern League South, East Division, 2017-18 saw the Row sat within the top four for much of the season, never dropping below 8th, and embark on their first FA Trophy campaign with wins against Gosport Borough and Farnborough before going out in the First Round Proper to eventual finalists, Bromley FC. A Play-off place was secured, the Row winning the semi-final against AFC Dunstable 2-0. Cambridge City had triumphed at Hayes & Yeading FC in the other semi. In front of a crowd of over 700 at Green Lane, a tense game was decided by a single goal scored by Nic Ciardini on the end of Jack Ball's towering header to gain promotion to the Southern Premier South at Step 3. The final season highlight was in lifting the Aldershot Senior Cup.

With Dan Turkington now co-manager alongside Anthony Millerick, 2018-19 started well at Step 3, but sustaining the early start proved difficult and the club found itself briefly in the relegation zone, but astute signings stiffened the defence and a late run saw Hartley finish 8th, an impressive achievement. To remain at the level also required another substantial round of ground improvements which stretched the club and its volunteers to the limits, but that too was achieved by the required deadline.


The Covid-19 affected 2019-20 Southern Premier South campaign only clicked into gear for the Row shortly before the season was abandoned. With Anthony Millerick

as manager, and Steve Noakes coming in alongside as his assistant, the return of several familiar faces in the New Year was pulling the team away from the 'worry zone' and promised fans an exciting

run-in to the end, but it was not to be. Instead what followed was a battle off the pitch for the club's survival in the face of the lost revenue due to extreme wet weather and then the pandemic.

Last season was again cut short by the coronavirus pandemic and league results declared void. However, the season was successful for two cup runs: In the FA Cup, Hartley reached the 4th Qualifying Round, going out at Dagenham & Redbridge FC to the only goal of the game after an excellent effort. In the Hampshire Senior Invitational Cup, staged as Covid restrictions were eased, Hartley reached the final and defeated Folland Sports 4-0 to lift the cup.

## MEET THE OPPO

- LUKE WILLIAMS Goalkeeper Signed for the club on the eve of the 2019/20 season and has been almost ever-present in the side since his arrival. He was also the winner of the Supporters' Player and Players' Player of the Season awards in 2020.
- NATHAN SMART Defender
  Club captain who made his debut in
  Hartley's first ever Step 3 match in
  August 2018. An experienced player
  who has been recently converted into
  a central defender and continues to
  lead by example.
- TOM BIRD Defender
  Vice captain and vastly experienced full back who made his Hartley debut in
  August 2019. In his two years with the club, his performances have been among the most consistent that the club has seen.
- MATT DRAGE Defender

  A mainstay in Hartley's defence since re-joining in February 2020, having had a seven-month spell with the club during the previous year. This season, he has formed a good partnership with

Nathan Smart at the back.

- JACQUES KPOHOMOUTH Defender Talented right back who made his debut in August 2018 during the club's first season at Step 3. After leaving later that same year, he re-signed for a second spell ahead of the 2021/22 season.
- RYAN CASE Defender

  An experienced and versatile player
  who made his debut in August 2021. He
  has so far been a good acquisition for
  Hartley this season, not least because
  of his threat from set pieces and ability
  to play at right back or in midfield.
- AARON GOODE Defender Strong and experienced central defender who is perhaps best described as a seasoned pro. With many years of playing at a good standard of non-league football, he made his Hartley debut in August 2021.
- LEO HAMBLIN Defender
  Signed on a short-term loan from
  Woking, making his debut in September
  2021. With the young left back keen to
  have a consistent run of games, he has

rewarded the club with some terrific performances.of his threat from set pieces and ability to play at right back or in midfield.

- JOSH WEBB Midfielder
  Made his debut in September 2017 and
  has made over 100 Southern League
  appearances for Hartley. He is also the
  only member of the current Hartley
  squad who was with the club for its
  play-off final win in 2018.
- HARRISON BAYLEY Midfielder
  Experienced and reliable holding
  midfielder who made his debut in
  September 2021. Prior to joining Hartley,
  he has played at every level of nonleague football from the National
  League to the Hellenic League.
- REECE WYLIE Midfielder
  Re-joined in September 2021 after brief
  spells with the club in 2019 and 2020.
  While he is naturally gifted with the ball,
  he has also demonstrated how
  industrious he is with his work rate and
  energy in midfield.
- JORDAN EDWARDS Midfielder Exciting young talent who made his debut in August 2021. As well as some impressive link-up play in the final third, he has also assumed responsibility as one of the best free kick takers in the squad.
- SAM SHAW Midfielder
  Made his debut in August 2021, his first experience of Southern League football. He has shown fantastic

potential during his short time in orange, with Hartley just one of many clubs who enquired about him in the summer.

- GEORGE SHERIDAN Midfielder Signed on a short-term loan from Aldershot, making his debut in August 2021. Although he is still very young, he has shown the ability to play beyond his years and really excels himself in midfield battles.
- KINGSLEY ESHUN Striker
  Made his debut in February 2020 and
  established himself as a firm fans'
  favourite the following season. He uses
  his strength and determination to great
  effect and has performed consistently
  to a high level.
- MITCHELL PARKER Striker
  After making his debut in December
  2018, he has featured in each of the last
  four seasons for the Row, albeit across
  three separate spells. A natural
  goalscorer, he most recently re-joined
  in October 2021.
- A club legend and former captain whose goals helped guide the Row to back-to-back league titles in the CCL Premier. After hitting 50 goals in successive seasons, he left the club in 2017 but returned three years later.

● SAM ARGENT - Striker

BEN WRIGHT - Striker

Powerful centre forward who made his
Hartley debut in August 2020. Vastly
experienced, having already
represented over 20 different clubs

prior to joining the Row, he previously made a handful of appearances in the EFL.

- REECE ROBINS Striker

  One of a talented crop of exciting young attackers within the Row's squad, he made his debut in September 2021.

  A player who has continued to show great promise since his first taste of senior football in 2018 aged 16.
- TOBY RAGGETT Striker

  Made his league debut in October
  2020, shortly followed by his first FA

  Cup appearance. A highly-rated young
  player who uses his speed to great
  effect, he has a fine goalscoring record
  for the Row in cup competitions.
- KHALID SIMMO Striker

  After a successful trial during preseason, he made his debut in August 2021. His speed and dynamic play have troubled defences this season and make him an exciting player to watch.
- PATRICK MOTINDO Striker
  Another possible option from the bench
  for Hartley, he made his debut as a
  substitute in September 2021. In his next
  appearance for the club, he scored the
  winning penalty that saw the Row
  progress in the League Cup.



#### THE MANAGEMENT TEAM

- ANTHONY MILLERICK Manager "Millers" was appointed in 2015 and the club has since climbed to the highest point in its history. Having already twice won the Combined Counties Premier, followed by promotion to Step 3 via the play-offs in 2018, the club also achieved a top half finish in the Southern League Premier three seasons ago, then equalled its best run in the FA Cup last season.
- STEVE NOAKES Asst. Manager Appointed as the club's assistant manager in 2019 after a five-year spell as a player. A central defender and former club captain who was part of the side that won back-to-back promotions.


It was a case of two points dropped for the Peacocks as they were forced to settle for a draw at a chilly Elmbridge Sports Hub.

Town had won both their previous visits to the Surrey club and Toby Holmes' first half opener had looked to be enough to secure another victory until a soft goal three minutes from time allowed Casuals a share of the spoils from a scrappy game.

An accident on the M3 meant the Peacocks did not arrive until 2.30, resulting in a delayed kick-off and with striker Jared Lewington having also dropped out due to Covid, preparations might have been smoother. Ross Stearn stepped in for Lewington, the only change from the midweek win at Weston, whilst Fixtures Secretary Martin Dongworth, in danger of missing his first game since 1976, managed to make the trip eastwards in time for kick-off.

Early play produced little to enthuse the crowd, John Gilbert's shot taking a deflection to earn the first corner of the game while Stearn's cross at the other end was cleared to Joe Guest who fired over the top from 12 yards. Holmes saw another shot suffer the same fate before a back pass from Rohdell Gordon caused some consternation for Casuals, Stearn appearing to be in at one stage before losing his footing.

The first real chance came for the hosts just past the 20 minute mark when Tom Bird's free kick picked out the unmarked Jerry Wiltshire, but he could only fire straight at Will Buse from close range. Tarik Moore-Azille then headed wide of the post from Bird's corner and Gilbert ballooned a strike over before Town won their first corner on 34 minutes following a terrific run from Ollie Chamberlain.



The Peacocks again had more of the play after the break but couldn't find a second goal to put the game to bed which eventually cost them. Casuals failed to clear an early corner, giving Budd a shooting chance, which was blocked, the follow-up from Chamberlain being drilled wide. Jay Foulston's cross was the wrong side of the inrushing Holmes and Stearn blasted a shot over after receiving Foulston's throw before a long kick downfield from Buse reached Stearn but the ball wouldn't come down for him to get a shot in

Walton meanwhile were not posing too many problems for the Town rearguard apart from Adam Liddle's cross flashing across goal and a free kick being conceded in a dangerous position just outside the box after Gordon had been tripped. The chipped set piece from Bird beat the wall but not Buse who caught comfortably. All too often though the football lacked composure from both sides.

Casuals' skipper Gabriel Odunaike drove wide after benefitting from a ricochet and

when Shaun McAuley's cross failed to get a touch from a Walton player it appeared as though Town would escape with the points as the match began to peter out. However, they were undone by a tame equaliser on 87 minutes, Gordon making inroads from the right before curling a cross towards the far post which escaped the attentions of all to sneak in at the post.

Town had one last opportunity to regain their advantage, a decent break ending with Stearn's shot being deflected for a corner from which Ben Adelsbury's header was caught by Adams at the back post. The contest ended on an acrimonious note in stoppage time when a straight red for Jake Wannell and a second yellow for Liddle saw both dismissed following a scuffle which sparked a melee between the teams, unfortunate given the benign nature of the previous 90 minutes.

On a positive note, it was another point on the road for the Peacocks who extend their unbeaten run to four games. In reality though it should have been all three from a match which will not live long in the memory.

### THE NON-LEAGUE PAPER

C O L U M N -

For some reason, I've got a rather anal fascination with the mentality of football managers at the moment.

You may recall in my last NLP programme column, I highlighted the new-age approach of the modern-day coach and questioned whether their scientific methods were overcomplicating the simple and beautiful game.

Since then, we've seen a number of notable shifts in momentum across the Non-League aame that only emphasizes my point further.

I've said for a long time that Non-League managers are one of a kind and that has been proved beyond doubt so far this season.

Take the situation at Barnet. No fewer than 11 managers have occupied the hotseat at The Hive over the last three years and only now are they actually showing signs of stability and, with it, progression.

The Bees were mighty fortunate to avoid the drop from the National League over the two Covid-hit seasons and this summer recruited former Leeds, Liverpool and Australian international Harry Kewell as their new manager.

As talented a coach as Harry clearly is, this never seemed the right fit and it was no surprise to us at NLP Towers to see the experiment come to a premature end with the club having taken just two points from their first seven games.

The answer, we believe, was under their nose all the time. Dean Brennan had been hired alongside Kewell to "oversee off-field football matters" - a role every bit as odd as it sounds.

Dean is one of Non-League football's brightest young managers having plied his trade at Hemel Hempstead Town, Billericay, Kingstonian and Wealdstone and it's no surprise to see him turning things around at The Hive in the manager's chair.

Another team forced into a change were Stockport County. Simon Rusk, fresh from the Brighton & Hove Albion academy, showed glimpses of why he is so highly-rated in the game but hardly pulled up trees with one of the divisions biggest budgets.

Cue then Dave Challinor, lured from Hartlepool United having steered them back into the Football League last season and suddenly Stockport look like world beaters. Don't be surprised to see Challinor adding another promotion to his glittering CV come May.

Phil Brown was another who struggled to adjust. The perma-tan boss may have managed in the top-flight with Hull City but looked a fish out of water in the National League at Southend United, prompting the Shrimpers to make an enforced change just 10 games into the club's first-ever Non-League campaign.

Indeed, testimony to the unique nature of a Non-League manager's job came from former England international Carlton Palmer in The NLP last week.

Speaking to Matt Badcock, Palmer told how his short spell in charge of Grantham Town proved a huge eye-opener, admitting that he wasn't fully prepared for the rigours of managing in the seventh tier of English football.

Palmer did, however, say he learned some valuable lessons in charge of the Gingerbreads and says he is ready for another crack of the whip with a fresh attitude and approach in place.

- 14. There will be zero tolorance to alcohol abuse/misuse.
- 15. There will be zero tolorance to drug possession, use and abuse.
- 16. Smoking is permitted in the stadium except in areas designated as a No Smoking area.
