# THE AWAY END

## Paulton Rovers

Paulton Rovers were formed in 1890 by the village's vicar and a local businessman.

The club joined the Western League in 1900 and the best ever position was runners up in 2003/4 securing promotion to the Southern League. They won the Somerset Senior Cup on twelve occasions, and the Somerset Senior League seven times, the last being in 1974, when they were re-admitted to the Western League after an absence of fourteen years.

Their best attendance of 2,070 (deemed maximum capacity) was on 7 November 2009 reaching the FA Cup 1st Round for the first time. The match v Norwich City, was live on ITV1 and to over 30 other countries. Prior to then a crowd believed estimated at over 2,000, saw them take on Crewe Alexandra in the FA Cup 5th qualifying round in 1906.

After playing at several venues in the village, Rovers moved to Winterfield Road in 1954. In 1967, an old RAF hut served as the club house with a licenced bar. Soon plans were drawn mortgage to build bigger premises including skittle alley. The pitch was turned 90 degrees so the club house is built on the one penalty area's. The social club is now the premier venue for many social occasions within the rapidly expanding local community.

New changing room block was built behind the main stand 1972, and the Club was further extended. On promotion to the Southern League the premises and stadium have been improved with the addition of another stand, and covered terracing, training facilities also include an all-weather floodlit court used by Paulton Rovers FC netball teams.

It was under the management team of Darren Perrin and Mike Kilgour that, Rovers

secured promotion to the Southern League. Rovers finished just outside the play-offs in the following season and Darren left for Premier Division, Chippenham Town.

In July 2005 Andy Jones stepped up from Reserve Manager. In 2006/7 the club finished runners up in Division 1 South & West Division One and narrowly missed out on the play offs the following year. His successful 5 year tenure was highlighted by reaching the 1<sup>st</sup> round of the FA Cup.

"Joner's" decided to move on in 2010 and former club captain, Mark Harrington took charge but he stood down after just one season to be replaced by former player, Nick Bunyard. Paul Milsom was assistant to all 3 managers during this time. However the season ended with Rovers winning the Somerset Premier Cup for the first time with a 3-1 win over Bridgwater Town.

After losing out in the play off the previous year in 2013/14 Rovers finished 4<sup>th</sup> spot and defeated Tiverton Town 3-1 in the semi final when down to 9 men, "Bunny's" men defied the odds to win the Play off Final at Merthyr Town in front of a crowd of 2,201 and thus gain promotion to Step 3 for the first time in their history.

2014/15 finished a more creditable 10<sup>th</sup> place in the Premier Division, during the close season Bunyard, resigned for personal reasons and the club appointed Richard Fey from Bridgwater Town, but after a disappointing start he resigned and former Bath City boss Tony Ricketts took charge at end of October. Unfortunately the club finished bottom and relegated back to Division 1 South and West.

Despite stabilising things Ricketts left at the end of 2016/17 and former Rovers keeper John Rendell was appointed bringing former player Paul Tovey as his assistant.

# MATCH REPORT

## TAUNTON TOWN WIMBORNE TOWN

Town maintained their impressive Southern League record at the Cygnet Health Care Stadium this season with a win over basement team Wimborne. The Peacocks have now won nine of their eleven home fixtures, with only one defeat, and their latest success proved fairly routine against a Magpies outfit which played better football than their position would indicate.

Several team changes were necessary from the previous weekend's visit to Dorchester, with Zac Smith absent with a painful toe, Jared Lewington suspended and centre half loan Richards pulling out before kick-off due to a sore quad muscle. Ben Adelsbury, Joe Budd and Gethyn Hill were all drafted in to replace, and it was Hill who posted the first effort of the game with a 20 yard lob wide of the target.

The visitors, fresh from a 6-0 county cup

victory in their most recent outing, responded immediately as they enjoyed a decent opening spell. Peacocks' keeper Will Buse held a shot from Lewis Beale before the Magpies won their first corner, Dan Bartlett crossing to Louis Kellaway who headed wide at the back post. Budd then earned the Peacocks their opening corner which produced a well-worked first goal after 13 minutes, with Jay Foulston delivering to the near post where Ollie Chamberlain ran in to direct a firm header into the unguarded net.

Wimborne came close ten minutes later when Jez Bedford drilled a strike into the side netting from just outside the box before their defence went AWOL on the half hour when Town added their second of the afternoon. Foulston's diagonal pass found Hill 35 yards or so out and after evading Harry Morgan's challenge, the

Peacocks striker meandered effortlessly through a static Wimborne backline to wrongfoot Gerard Benfield and roll the ball into the left-hand corner.

Hill then teed up Ross Stearn for a shot which flew over the top at the Travis Perkins End as Town searched for a third while Buse still had to be alert at the opposite end as he clutched a low Curtis Young shot from the right side of the area. The half ended with Lloyd James threading a fine pass through to Budd on the right, but his strike cannoned off Benfield's leg before the hosts came mightily close to making it 3-0 four minutes after the break. Hill lofted a ball over the top which found Stearn who prodded past Benfield, the ball taking a deflection off the keeper's foot to hit the post.

Town's positive start to the second half continued when Chamberlain beat two men on the left, his cross coming quickly to Stearn who couldn't get enough pace in his effort which was cleared, then Stearn's free kick was held by Benfield after Toby Holmes had been fouled. Holmes soon came back to haunt his former club when he extended the Peacock's lead with his 15th goal of the season on 56 minutes. James' ball down the right saw Holmes rob Billy Maybury and advance into the box before directing a shot across Benfield into the far corner via a deflection off Callum Chugg. The Magpies quickly pulled a goal back just a minute later, Bedford nodding down to Morgan on the left side of the box and the Wimborne skipper held off the defence to beat Buse inside his near post.

Despite their perseverance there was little likelihood of this goal being the springboard for a comeback from the visitors. The last half hour of the contest saw the Peacocks look to restore their three goal cushion and repeat the scoreline from the first meeting of the sides on the opening day of the season. Hill headed narrowly wide when he got on the end of Foulston's free kick, then another set piece saw Foulston himself curl his effort wide. The Magpies' attempts were less than accurate, Bartlett blasting a strike wide and Morgan ballooning over from a short corner routine although they did register another attempt on target when Buse safely held Morgan's shot.

After a delay for treatment to Nick Grimes and Jamie Henry following a clash of heads, Town made their only change of the game with Dan Sullivan replacing Holmes. The final stages were punctuated by the Peacocks just failing to convert several opportunities. Stearn's cross in from the right was inches ahead of both Sullivan and Hill, then Sullivan's ball across carried too much pace for Stearn to capitalise and Budd's centre was cleared over the bar by a Wimborne defender in stoppage time. Another win for the Peacocks who did not need to go up the gears to see off a plucky Wimborne team, the victory making it ten competitive games unbeaten in front of the second highest crowd of the season at the Cygnet.

# THE NON-LEAGUE PAPER

They say that football and politics should never mix – just ask the officials at Chester FC this week.

In a bizarre twist to start the new year, the National League North Blues have been dragged into a Covid border war with both English and Welsh governments claiming authority on its jurisdiction.

As you may know, the club's Deva Stadium straddles the English/Welsh border but although Chester is an English football club, based in an English city and playing in an English league, the ground, although owned by Cheshire West and Cheshire Council is, apparently, governed by Welsh regulations.

This week, the Blues were presented with a joint letter from North Wales Police and Flintshire County Council informing them of potential Welsh Coronavirus Regulations breaches for their home games against AFC Fylde on December 28 and AFC Telford United on January 2.

As a result, the club have now informed supporters that further potential breaches could be brought if it continued to play home fixtures with crowds while the current restrictions in Wales are in place. Strict new rules mean that live sport in the country can only be attended by 50 people, as the likes of Wrexham and Merthyr Town are, as it stands, having to abide by.

Chester chiefs are currently seeking legal advice but, ultimately, it could mean Chester having to play homes games behind closed doors until Welsh regulations are eased or lifted.

For Chester, playing to an empty Deva Stadium isn't an option, as vice-chairman Jim Green warned.

"I think all parties need to take a step back, reflect and take some more legal advice," he said. "The implications of this decision and outcome are very significant."

"It's not viable for us to play without fans in the stadium so it's going to need some cool heads and common-sense thinking."

What a bizarre situation this is. Pubs and clubs remain open and supporters are still free to pile onto coaches and cross the border to watch their away games.

In theory, Chester could erect a big screen in their car park and let thousands of fans attend to watch a game being played yards away.

The situation all makes for a very frustrating situation, with the Blues seeking legal advice to confirm their stance.

Chester have clearly been caught in some serious crossfire here as the British nations try to learn to live with Covid without having to shut down entirely.

## CYGNET HEALTHCARE STADIUM REGULATIONS

7. Persons must not use obscene, indecent, discriminatory, offensive or threatening language.
8. Persons must not use obscene, indecent, discriminatory, offensive or threatening gestures.
9. Persons must not damage or deface Club and Stadium property.
10. Persons must not damage, deface or obstruct any notice or advertisement.
11. Alcohol must not be brought into the stadium.
12. Persons must not consume alcohol that has not been purchased at Taunton Town FC.
13. Persons must not consume alcohol in any alcohol free designated areas.
14. There will be zero tolerance to alcohol abuse/misuse.
15. There will be zero tolerance to drug possession, use and abuse.
16. Smoking is permitted in the stadium except in areas designated as a No Smoking area.
17. Umbrellas are permitted within the stadium but must not be used if obstructing the view of other spectators.

Spectators must also note the following:

- A) The Club does not accept any responsibility or liability whatsoever for any loss or damage to vehicles or their contents, or any other personal property brought onto the Clubs premises and stadium.
- B) The Club is unable to accept any additional responsibility for minors attending matches beyond those matters covered by the Stadium Regulations.
- C) Photography and use of video including CCTV is in operation at all matches and events and may be used in any of our media channels as well as press releases.
- D) Dogs on a lead are permitted in the Stadium but they remain the sole responsibility of their owner at all times.
