#### THE PEACOCKS - ISSUE 20 vs Hendon 19.2.22





Hendon FC are now into their 12th season (including the two curtailed ones) under the ownership of their supporters, following their takeover of the club in the summer of 2010.

Hendon has an illustrious and proud history. The club was formed in 1908, beginning its existence as Christ Church Hampstead. In their inaugural season, the club finished as champions of the Finchley & District League Third Division. There was regular success in the early years, but not before the first of four name changes.

Ahead of the 1909-10 season, the club became Hampstead Town, and immediately won the Finchley & District League Second Division title, and the First Division title followed a year later. Further successes followed as the club gained senior status in 1912 (entering the FA and county cups for the first time) and competing in both the London and Middlesex Leagues. On the back of this, the club was elected into the Athenian League in 1914, one of the best competitions in amateur football, this just six years into the club's existence.

Hampstead Town had played only two matches in 1914-15 (both away draws) when season was abandoned because of the outbreak of war. In their eventual debut season, 1919-20, the club finished a highly creditable fourth. The club finished runners-up in 1929, 1933, 1948, 1949 and 1952, before eventually winning the title in 1953. Further titles followed in 1956 and 1961.

The second renaming of the club came in 1926, when the suffix Town was dropped, and the club was simply called Hampstead. Seven years later the club became Golders Green and the final name change came in 1946 when the club became known as Hendon.

There had been another Hendon club - it reached the quarter-finals of the FA Cup in 1883 - and, in 1932, Hendon and Hampstead met in two friendlies, the second of

which was to raise funds for the former club. Sadly, Hendon – which appeared to add and drop the Town suffix in their dying years – ceased to exist a couple of years later, but their continued existence meant Hampstead had been unable to take the name in 1933. It was as Golders Green that the club made its first appearance in the FA Cup competition proper, losing in the first round to Southend United in 1933–34.

In 1963, after more than half a dozen rejections in the previous 50 years, the club was accepted into the Isthmian League and the Greens were members for 55 seasons, always competing in the top division. Success continued as they finished runners-up in their first season, followed by the first of two league titles a year later. Hendon were again champions in 1973, adding to their runners-up achievements in 1966, 1974 and 2015. Indeed, in their first 11 seasons in the Isthmian League, Hendon never finished lower than sixth. Since then From the mid-1970s, the club has had both good and bad seasons in the League, and in 2006 the club was reprieved from relegation due to another club's financial misfortune.

During the amateur era, the club reached the final of the FA Amateur Cup no less than five times, winning in 1960 (against Kingstonian), 1965 (against Whitley Bay) and 1972 (against Enfield) but losing in 1955 (against Bishop Auckland) and 1966 (against Wealdstone).

The club throughout its history has enjoyed FA Cup success. As well as 21 appearances in the first round (most recently at Aldershot Town in 2012), there have been six appearances in the second round (most recently in 1999-2000 at Blackpool) and one in the third round in January 1974 which saw the Greens draw 1-1 at Newcastle United before losing the replay 4-0 at Watford FC's Vicarage Road.

The club has also enjoyed much glory in county cups, winning the Middlesex Senior Cup no less than 16 times out of 28 final appearances, as well as winning the Middlesex Charity Cup 14 times (two of which, in 1945 and 1988, were at Wembley Stadium). The London Senior Cup has been won on six occasions, with a further 9 appearances in the final.

Hampstead moved into its Claremont Road ground in 1926, the first game being an FA Cup tie against Berkhamsted Town 18 September, which Hendon won 4-3. The final match was played 82 years later, almost to the day, on 20 September 2008, when local rivals Wealdstone won 4-1 (Hendon's last goal at Claremont Road came from Dave Diedhiou, who would make 382 appearances and score 43 goals).

After leaving Claremont Road, Hendon spent four years ground-sharing with

Wembley FC and, from 2013, a three-season arrangement with Harrow Borough FC at Earlsmead. In February 2014, plans moved to return close to the London Borough of Barnet at the old Kingsbury Town FC ground, Silver Jubilee Park (the borough boundary is around 20 metres behind the clubhouse). A FIFA-accredited 3G all-weather pitch was installed and certified in October 2014. Following this, a successful planning application in July 2015 allowed the club – with Edgware Town FC – to redevelop the stadium.

In 2014, Hendon relaunched their youth section, with 15 sides taking the field. This youth policy paid dividends after as a number of players have moved up from the youth team to the senior side and one, Keagan Cole, aged 18, became the youngest ever Hendon player to complete 100 first-team appearances (17 goals). In 2016-17, Hendon added girls teams to boys youth teams.

Hendon's move into Silver Jubilee Park in 2016 was more successful off the pitch than on it and it took until January for a first home League win to be achieved. A last-day draw, completing a run of 22 points from 10 games, saw the club achieve safety from relegation. The 2017-18 season was nearly glorious. Led by the prolific 92-goal attack of Niko Muir (40 goals – first in 19 years), Zak Joseph (18), Ashley Nathaniel-George (17) and Josh Walker (17), Hendon roared to third place in the Bostik League – second top-three finish in four seasons – and reached the playoff final. Sadly, it was not to be as Dulwich Hamlet won a penalty shoot-out.

A new era dawned in summer 2018 as The Football Association announced that Hendon would be playing in the Southern Premier Division South, the Greens' first League change since 1963. An even bigger change came as manager Gary McCann, his coaching staff and every senior player moved on to pastures new (though, one, Luke Tingey, did return at the end of preseason). Hendon made a great start to their new competition and were second in December, but a long losing run saw them narrowly avoid relegation in spring 2019. The Greens made a slow start to the new season and, in November, manager Jimmy Gray departed, being replaced by Biggleswade Town boss Lee Allinson.

Lee, whose father lan played for Arsenal and now manages St Albans City, was a talented midfielder who started his playing career at Watford and went on to play for Harlow Town, Barton Rovers, Enfield, Stotfold, Borehamwood, Arlesey Town and Biggleswade Town before becoming assistant manager, then manager there. An experienced coach, he – with his wife Faye – has run his own coaching academy in Stevenage since 2012. The pandemic means that 2021-22 will be Lee's third season as Hendon boss, but he entered with just 39 competitive games – but it did include the London Senior Cup triumph over Brentford B in September 2020.

**RICARDO ALEXANDER-GREENAWAY** - Member of the U18 squad signed on first team forms in March 2018. Left the club at the end of the 2018/9 season having made the breakthrough into the first-team during the autumn of 2018 to join former Under-23 manager Fin Johnson at Chalfont St Peter where he spent two seasons. Rejoined from Chalfont St Peter in summer 2021.

LUCA ALLINSON - Midfielder who made the move from Biggleswade Town in November 2019. Previously seen service at St Albans City and Potton United.

YASIN ARAI - Midfielder who signed for the club in January 2022 following a spell at Kings Langley.

**KENDALL ATAGYAMFI** - Young striker who signed first-team forms in October 2021 having impressed for the Under-19s after coming through the Limitless Academy. Has previously been with ASE Academy and Wormley Rovers.

**TOMMY BREWER** - Signed from St Albans City in November 2019 having joined the Saints from Tonbridge Angels. Tommy, who can play in defence or midfield, has a wealth of experience having enjoyed spells at Lewes, Wealdstone, Staines Town, Hampton & Richmond, Kingstonian and Walton Casuals. LIAM BROOKS - Forward who signed in November 2019 from Biggleswade Town. Has previously seen service with Baldock Town, Hitchin Town, Stotfold, Codicote and Leighton Town

FRED BURBIDGE - Goalkeeper who signed in the summer of June 2021 after a spell with Isthmian League club Potters Bar Town. Fred was also previously with Bishop's Stortford and Boreham Wood as well as a former England College's representative.


JAYDEN CLARKE - Wide midfielder who signed in August 2020, joining the club from Bedfont Sports after impressing in preseason.

SAM CORCORAN - Midfielder signed in July 2019 having left Royston Town. He began his career at Colchester United and went on to see service with Wealdstone and Lowestoft Town on-loan, before moving onto spells with Chelmsford City, Hayes and Yeading United, St Albans City (twice), Hemel Hempstead Town and AFC Sudbury

KIERON FORBES - Midfielder who joined the club in November 2019 having been Lee Allinson's first signing at Biggleswade Town. Began his career at Watford before spells with Forest Green Rovers, Maidenhead United, Whitehawk, Aldershot Town, Sutton

RICARDO GERMAN - Harlesden born striker who returned to the club on-loan from Crawley Town in February 2022 for his second spell. Originally signed from Chesterfield in August 2018. Made his senior Chesterfield debut aged 17 in September 2016, and went on to make 12 appearances for them. Had spells at Alfreton Town, Sheffield and Matlock Town on loan last season. Left towards the end of December 2018 having scored 21 goals and signed for Crawley in January 2019.

**QUBA GORDON** - Quba returned for a second spell with the club in the summer of 2021 having initially signed on youth loan terms from Boreham Wood in December 2016. Since then he played with distinction for the all-conquering Maldon & Tiptree United side before a spell last season in Step 2 at Welling United.

WILL HALL - Young defender who signed on a work experience loan deal from Watford in January 2022. Highly thought of at Vicarage Road, Will had experience at Kings Langley earlier in the season

**CAIN KELLER** - Young midfielder signed in November 2021 having come through the ranks at Stevenage.

**EREN KINALI** - 21-year old midfielder who originally signed on-loan from Southend United in November 2021 before returning for a second loan spell in January 2022. Came through the ranks at Roots Hall and has also had spells at Royston Town and Brightlingsea Regent on-loan.

SHAUN LUCIEN - Shaun returned to the club in November 2019 after a spell with Biggleswade Town. Originally joined the club in October 2018 from Kingstonian. Began his career at Brentford, before going on to play for Hampton & Richmond Borough, Harrow Borough, Uxbridge, Wealdstone and St Albans City.

**TAFARI MOORE** - Defender who signed for the club in September 2021 following a long spell out injured. Prior to his injury Tafari, who came through the ranks at Arsenal, had more than 60 professional appearances to his name following spells with FC Utrecht, Wycombe Wanderers, Plymouth Argyle and Colchester United. Also represented England at each age level from Under-16s to Under-20s and was named in the team of the tournament at the 2014 Under-17 European Championships.

MAURICE NUGENT - Defender who joined the club in January 2022 following a lengthy spell at Irish League side Galway United. Mo joined Galway in 2015 and went on to represent Irish Universities at two World University Games.

ANIS NUUR - Attacking midfielder signed from Cray Wanderers in October 2021. Previously seen service with Tooting & Mitcham, Westfield and Hartley Wintney before moving to Cray in the summer of 2021.

JOSHUA OKOTCHA - Defender who signed for the club in January 2022 after being released by West Ham United where he spent 8 years and signed professional forms in June 2020.

SIMEON OLARERIN - Full back who signed from Staines Town in January 2020. Has also spent time with Hayes & Yeading United.

**CHRISTOS PAPAKONSTANTINOU** - Winger signed on Christmas Eve 2021 from Dorchester Town. Scored twice for the Magpies against Hendon in August 2021 having signed for them that summer following spells at AFC Bournemouth and Aldershot Town. Began his career as a youngster at Greek giants Olympiakos.

**LUCAS PERRY** - Left-back who joined the club from Biggleswade Town in November 2019. Had a season at Barton Rovers following his release from Luton Town.

**KYRON RICHARDS** - Midfielder signed in November 2021 from Lewes. Equally capable at centre-back and full-back, Kyron also had a spell at Cray Wanderers.

HAMZA SEMAKULA - Young midfielder who signed for the club in the summer of 2021. A former England Colleges international who began at Boreham Wood before having spells at Chalfont St Peter, Enfield Borough and St Panteleimon.

CHRISTIAN SMITH - Experienced and much travelled midfielder who signed for the club in the summer of 2021 from Hayes & Yeading United. Christian began his career at Port Vale and enjoyed loan spells at Cambridge United and Northwich Victoria before moving north of the border to Clyde and then west to Wrexham. Amongst other clubs he's played for are Chester, Stafford Rangers, AFC Telford United, Chelmsford City, Bishop's Stortford, Maidenhead United, Wealdstone, Dulwich Hamlet and Hampton & Richmond Borough.

BOBBY UNWIN - Young wide player who signed in January 2022 from National League side Southend United on a month's loan. Came through the ranks at Roots Hall and had a similar spell earlier this season at Bishop's Stortford

**ETHAN WADY** - Goalkeeper signed on January deadline day from Chelsea on a season long loan in 2022. US-born who has played for the USA at Under-17 level and has had experience at Non-League level with Tooting & Mitcham and Dartford.

JOE WHITE - Centre forward signed in January 2020 from League 2 Stevenage where he spent a couple of years. Originally had a spell in January 2018 on a months loan from Dagenham & Redbridge. Left after 3 weeks to sign for Stevenage on deadline day having become the 9th player to score a record 5 goals in a game for the Greens. 

The Peacocks promotion charge continued as they ticked off their ninth League win on the bounce and their 14th without defeat. It wasn't the most thrilling of games with chances in short supply overall and with Town not firing on all cylinders against a decent Marine outfit. However, and not for the first time this season, the Peacocks found a route to victory thanks to two second half goals which secured them the League double over their visitors.

Jay Foulston made a welcome return at left back, the only change from the previous week at Merthyr, while loan striker Prince Henry made his home debut, but the Peacocks were slow to settle into the contest against a livelier Marine. A quick break saw Harry Williams feed Ryan Campbell on the left but his ball across goal failed to find anyone before their first corner from Tom Mehew was cleared by Joe Guest. Town's opening gambit came just past the quarter hour mark when Ross Stearn was brought down 20 yards out, but Lloyd James curled the free kick over the top.

Will Buse caught a Henry Spalding corner which prompted a few feeble claims that the ball had carried over the line, however this aside Supermarine appeared the more fluent going forward, with the movement of Conor McDonagh keeping the Town defence on their toes. After seeing a shot deflect for a corner, his neat back heel then set up Williams, but he stumbled as he shot, and the ball travelled wide before another neat bout of play saw Campbell feed McDonagh whose strike from the left side of the box was held by Buse.

In response Town had a penalty appeal waved away after Stearn went down

In response Town had a penalty appeal waved away after Stearn went down before Marine keeper Martin Horsell was called into action, parrying Joe Budd's shot from the edge of the area with Foulston drilling the loose ball wide of the target. Stearn then played in Henry who seemed to be fouled but nothing given while Jake Wannell tried his luck from distance, his leftfooter whistling just the wrong side of the post.

Jared Lewington replaced Henry for the second half and his introduction led to the breakthrough after 50 minutes. Lewington's looping header from Budd's cross was palmed over by Horsell and Marine failed to clear the resulting Foulston corner, which was hooked back in by Guest, Nick Grimes nodded on to Ben Adelsbury whose header was kept out by the arm of Williams. When all the Marine protests had died down, Williams departed after being red-carded and Stearn kept his cool to send Horsell the wrong way from the penalty spot.

Grimes fired a dipping shot over the bar before Supermarine conjured up one of their few offerings of the second half, Mehew venturing infield for a ground shot which was bread and butter for Buse to hold. The visitors forward spark had diminished while the Peacocks cohesion had markedly improved, and they maybe should have doubled their lead when Stearn ran through the middle and laid off to Zac Smith on the right, but he got too much on the shot which was blasted over.

Town continued to press for a second potentially decisive goal, Smith seeing more

of the ball down the right flank and when his cross was blocked, he had another chance to deliver, his lofted chip towards the back post being clutched by Horsell. The goal when it arrived though came from the other flank and what a peach it was. Dan Sullivan, who had only replaced Budd five minutes earlier, found Foulston out wide and he nonchalantly drifted in from the left past a couple of opponents before smashing a strike across Horsell into the top corner of the net. Pick that one out!

A purposeful run from Smith nearly produced a third soon after but Lewington was unable to connect with his ball into the middle. Supermarine made a few forward excursions in the final stages but really only had one effort, McDonagh firing over the top, as the Peacocks' rearguard remained solid. Mission accomplished for Town who strengthen their 4th place position on the back of results elsewhere but they now focus on the Cup when they travel to mee the same opposition in the League Cup Semi-Final in three days' time.

Regular contributor to our letters page, Marine superfan Barry Lenton, suggests Peter Smith with 957, while we also had shouts from Bognor Regis Town and Hampton & Richmond Borough.

The nature of Non-League football means it

may be hard to come up with a definitive answer.

Earlier in the season, we spoke to Terry Buss at Hanworth Villa as the one-club man celebrated 800 official appearances for the Step 5 outfit - although he wondered if it was even more than that.

The 35-year-old keeper made his debut when he was 16 - illustrating just how long it takes to rack up these numbers - and he was eveing 1,000.

"I'll go as long as my body lets me, it's starting to ache now!" he told The NLP. "Now that the 800 is up, the magic 1,000 is in sight. It would be another three or four years without missing a game but I've not missed many over the last 19 years so, fingers crossed, I can have a good go.

"My son, Jimmy, is 12, I'm hoping when he gets to 16 he's good enough to come in and take over from me!"

- 10. Persons must not damage, deface or obstruct any notice or advertisement.
- 11. Alcohol must not be brought into the stadium.
- 12. Persons must not consume alcohol that has not been purchased at Taunton Town FC.
- 13. Persons must not consume alcohol in any alcohol free designated areas.
- 14. There will be zero tolorance to alcohol abuse/misuse.
- 15. There will be zero tolorance to drug possession, use and abuse.
- 16. Smoking is permitted in the stadium except in areas designated as a No Smoking area.
- 17. Umbrellas are permitted within the stadium but must not be used if obstructing the view of other spectators.
