In 2000 Weston secured the purchase of the Westlands Site only a stone's throw away from Woodspring Park.

During the last month of the season 2015/16, the Seagulls once again turned on the style and ended the season with 6 unbeaten games from 7, with Scott Wilson and Dayle Grubb netting in a 2-0 win over Maidstone to spark manic celebrations from the home fans at The Woodspring knowing that the Seagulls had avoided relegation. With the season ending in a party atmosphere in Havant on the 30th April, with fan favourite Scott Wilson sliding home at the far post to ultimately send Havant down and keep Margate down.

The 2016/17 league season started off promisingly, with three wins and a draw from the first four games, putting Weston at the top of the table. Shawn McCoulsky, who joined the Seagulls on loan from Bristol City days before the season began, scored four goals in the opening four games to see Weston start off stronger than ever expected. Then, a run of seven league games and a 2-1 defeat to North Leigh in the Second Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, despite the re-signing of Brad Ash on loan from Barnsley in the middle of the run, saw the sacking of Head Coach Ryan Northmore, with his replacement being former Weston player and current Forest Green Rovers Head of Youth Scott Bartlett as his replacement, with Chris Barker joining the side as Player/Assistant Manager. Bartlett and Barker were given the task of keeping the Seagulls in the National League South, and a tricky November saw things look bleaker than before, despite a 4-3 win away to Eastbourne Borough. The defensive signing of Rollin Menayese in December saw an upturn in Weston's form, with new signing Gethyn Hill poking home away to Truro on Boxing Day for a vital three points. As 2017 rolled around, Weston got into their stride thanks to Dayle Grubb's two trademark free-kicks against Truro on New Year's Day, with the team going on a good run of form to start off the second half of the season, a 3-2 loss away to Dartford in January being the only blemish to their good form. March saw the games come thick and fast, with the majority of the fixtures against teams at the top end of the table. Weston lost out to Bath 2-1 thanks to McCoulsky's 88th minute winner for the Romans, but Weston still had survival to secure after the trickiest month the club endured all season. Grubb turned on the style heading into April, scoring four times in a 5-0 rout against Bishops Stortford, before Ash was at the double to relegate Margate on Good Friday, with a 3-0 loss to St Albans, and results going Weston's way, enough to keep the side up on Easter Monday. Weston ended the league season with a 5-0 win away to Hemel Hempstead, with Grubb being named the National League South Player of The Month for April. In his final game in charge, Bartlett saw Weston lose 4-2 to Taunton Town in the Somerset Premier Cup Final. Rollin Menayese left to join the Bristol Rovers U23 side, with him appearing to be the U23s captain, with Bartlett then taking up a full-time role as FGR Head of Youth upon their promotion to League Two. Barker opted to terminate his contract as well and has since joined FGR as Head of Academy to Bartlett, with Weston appointing new manager and former player Marc McGregor two days after Bartlett's departure. Rob Boyd joined Weston as first-team coach and assistant to Macca.

The 2017-2018 season didn't get off to a particularly good start, with the Seagulls losing their opening three league games. Weston started to pick up some form as they headed into September, playing Wealdstone memorably off the park in a 5-1 victory at the Woodspring. Weston's form continued to improve largely thanks to the form of Dayle Grubb, and manager Marc McGregor picked up the November Manager of The Month for the National League South. Grubb departed for Forest Green Rovers at the start of January, and an inconsistent spell during the second half of the season saw the Seagulls' playoff push fall away as the season approached the final months. Backup goalkeeper Liam Kingston was the Somerset Premier Cup semi-final hero, saving a spot-kick in a penalty shootout over Bath City. In May 2018, Weston won the Somerset Premier Cup against Paulton Rovers after going 2-0 down, with Tristan Plummer scoring the winner in added time to cue dramatic scenes on the pitch and in the stands.

LUKE PURNELL - Luke progressed through the Academy from the age of 16 and gained experience within the Western League before moving on to Dawlish Town, Barnstaple Town and Bridgwater Town. He returned in the summer of 2013 and has since established himself as Weston's No.1 keeper, making over 300 appearances in net for the club.

MAX HARRIS - Harris progressed through the youth academy at Hereford FC and made appearances for their first team before joining the setup at Oxford United. At Oxford, he had loan spells with Staines Town, Abingdon United, AFC Totton and Oxford City before being released in the summer of 2020. Signing for Cheltenham, he spent the first season with the Robins before joining Cinderford Town and Redditch on loan this season. Harris joined Weston on loan in October 2021.

SCOTT LAIRD - Weston's playerassistant manager began at Plymouth Argyle and spent time on loan with Tiverton Town, Torquay United and Stevenage after being offered a professional contract at the Pilgrims in 2006. In February 2008, he joined Stevenage permanently and helped them progress into the EFL. Upon leaving in 2012, he spent time with Preston North End, Scunthorpe United, Forest Green Rovers and two loan spells with Walsall. In 2019, he signed for Weston upon his FGR release.

SAM AVERY - The experienced defender progressed through the Gloucester City Academy, before leaving in 2005 to join Chipping Norton FC. He went on to have two spells with Bishops Cleeve as well as spells at Carterton Town and Shortwood United before rejoining Gloucester in 2014. He spent the next six years at the club, including a period as captain, before joining the Seagulls in January 2021.

NICK McCOOTIE - The powerful striker came through the academy at Bristol City before leaving for Yate Town, going on to represent Taunton Town, Bridgwater Town, Cinderford Town and Paulton Rovers before joining Bath City in 2014. Leading their line effectively, he became one of the league's mostfeared strikers before joining Chippenham Town in 2018. Spending the next 18 months in Wiltshire, he joined Weston in the summer of 2019.

DAYLE GRUBB - The club legend signed for the club at 16 in 2007, captaining the under-18 and under-19 sides before moving into the first team during the 2009/2010 season. He spent the next eight seasons as a pivotal role at the club, establishing himself as a firm fans' favourite. In January 2018, he completed a move to Forest Green Rovers in the EFL, spending the next 30 months there including a short loan spell at Eastleigh. In August 2020, he rejoined the club on a four-year contract.

JACOB JAGGER-CANE - The energetic midfielder started out at Exeter City, becoming a professional in 2012. He spent two loan spells with Poole Town and one with Weymouth over the next two years before being released by Exeter in 2014. Upon release, he signed for the Seagulls and became a key part of the side over the next five years. In 2019, he joined Hereford FC, with a loan spell at Weston coming later on that season. In 2020, he rejoined the club on a permanent basis.

LLOYD HUMPHRIES - Humphries began his career as a Cardiff City player, signing a professional contract in 2016. His first taste of first-team football came with a loan spell under Scott Bartlett in 2016/2017 at Weston before injuries impacted his development over a two-year spell. He returned to Weston on loan during 2019/2020 before being released by Cardiff at the end of the season. He joined Weston at the start of the 2020/2021 season on a permanent basis.

JAY MURRAY - Jay spent his youth days in Weston's Academy and went on to feature for Congresbury and Cheddar Reserves at youth level. He then went on to represent Odd Down twice and Hengrove Athletic in the Western League before joining Clevedon Town, where his impressive performances across a two-year span saw him sign for the Seagulls for the 21-22 season.

JASON POPE - The ball-playing defender came through the Exeter City Academy and signed a professional contract in 2014. He came to Weston, originally on loan, during the 2015-2016 season before joining permanently in 2016 after his Exeter release. Spending the next three years as a mainstay in the defence, he spent a season with both Hereford FC and Bath City before rejoining for the current season.

JORDAN BASTIN - The summer signing spent time with the youth sides of Exeter, Plymouth and Tiverton Town. He played for Tiverton Reserves before joining Elmore FC in 2017, scoring 70 goals in two seasons before rejoining Tiverton, this time their first team. He scored 16 goals in 44 appearances across two Covid-hit seasons before signing for Weston.

JAMES DODD - Progressing through the Exeter City Academy, the midfielder turned professional in 2018 with the Grecians. Spending a month on loan with Taunton across the 2018 festive period before returning to Exeter, the midfielder then went on to suffer a couple of injury-hit seasons. As he returned to fitness in the 2021 summer, he was included in Exeter's first-team squad at the start of the season before joining Weston on loan until January in September.

ALFIE MOULDEN - Joining Weston in October 2021, Alfie played locally for Devon with sides such as Bideford, Ilfracombe and Barnstaple before getting his break with Willand Rovers after joining them in 2020. His impressive form for Willand at the start of the season saw the Seagulls snap him up quickly.

MARLON JACKSON - The experienced striker began with the Bristol City Academy and spent loan spells with Hereford United, Aldershot Town, Northampton, Cheltenham and AFC Telford. Upon leaving Bristol City, he has spent time with Hereford, Bury, Lincoln City, FC Halifax, Oxford City, Tranmere Rovers and Newport County. Jackson joined Weston for the first time in 2018, finishing as 2018-2019's top scorer before leaving for Gloucester City and then Chippenham Town. He returned to Weston in November 2021.

JOSH THOMAS - The defensive midfielder began his career in the Hereford United and Cheltenham Town academies before signing professional with the latter in 2017. During his time at Cheltenham, he enjoyed three loan spells with North Leigh before the Robins released him in 2018. Spending the first part of 2018-2019 with Westfields FC, he joined Gloucester City in December 2018 and was there for three years until joining Taunton Town in October 2021. A month later, he made the move to the Seagulls.

KEIRAN THOMAS - The no-nonsense full-back began his career at Cheltenham Town, spending part of the 2012/2013 season on loan at Cinderford Town. After being released by Chelteham at the age of 18 in 2013, he spent the next three years on Cinderford's books, being their captain during 2015/2016 as they won the Southern League South & West. In 2016, he moved to Gloucester City where he spent two seasons before spending the same amount of time at Hereford FC. In 2020, he signed for Weston.



Toby Holmes scored a priceless winner six minutes from time to keep the Peacock's promotion dream very much alive on a sunny spring afternoon at Privett Park. The win will go down as one of the most satisfying of the season, with Town struggling to make up the numbers against a Borough side still eyeing that final spot in the play-offs and the first half played out against that backdrop but the second half was a different story when the visitors might have won more comfortably had they capitalised on a number of chances.

Already missing a number of the squad for various reasons, preparation was disrupted further when striker Jared Lewington pulled out with Covid on the morning of the game, leaving Town with just two fit outfield players on the bench and the early signs indicated it would be a hard afternoon on the south coast. Rory Williams fired an early strike just over from 30 yards and then Luke Hallett ghosted on to the end of a Williams' free kick but could only chest the ball straight to Will Buse in the Town goal.

Billie Busari then made ground in from the right to see his shot deflect narrowly wide as the hosts dominated possession in the first quarter of the contest before there was yet more upheaval to the Town team when Joe Budd had to go off with a dead leg to be replaced by Ross Staley. The visitors produced little up front until 26 minutes in when Lloyd James' threaded a pass into the path of Gethyn Hill, but Hallett managed to block the effort with his leg.

A dangerous Williams' free kick from the left was then glanced on by Dan Wooden with the ball deflecting safely to Buse before the Peacocks came close to opening the scoring on 34 minutes when Ben Adelsbury's header found the inside of the post from a Jay Foulston corner, with Town unable to force the ball over the line amidst a crowd of bodies in the ensuing melee. Gosport broke away from this to earn a Williams free kick which deflected wide while Wooden failed to make the most of it when he appeared to be through after a defensive slip. Bradley Tarbuck's cross was then volleyed well over the top by Matt Briggs as the first 45 minutes concluded with Borough having the better of it overall.

The second half opened with Gosport on the front foot, Tarbuck running from the centre circle to test Buse with a shot from just outside the box, the loose ball falling to Wooden, but Buse was there again to deny him from a narrow angle. The woodwork came to Town's rescue five minutes in when Tarbuck's header from a Williams cross hit the base of the post while Harry Kavanagh's ball into the middle saw Buse unable to claim but Adelsbury was on hand to clear as Borough clearly demonstrated their intent to remain in the play-off mix. However a great chance came and went for the Peacocks to relieve the pressure with a goal at the other end, Joe Guest hooking a pass out to Staley on the left and his cross was guided the wrong side of the post by the oncoming Hill.

The Peacocks were now looking a far more menacing prospect and began to look the likelier side to break the deadlock. Holmes got clear down the left to see his effort clawed wide by Ellis Grant while the Town striker beat a defender on the opposite side and was poised to create more havoc but was crowded out by the home defence. A spell of Gosport pressure saw Wooden miss the target by inches with a clever volley from Kavanagh's cross, however the clearer opportunities were falling Town's way. Hill glanced a header wide from Guest's cross and a lovely pass from James found Holmes in space on the right side of the area, but Grant stood firm to block the shot. Another gilt-edged chance was missed when James' long pass picked out Staley on the penalty spot, Grant getting down well to turn the shot wide.

With Town now on top, the momentum was towards the Borough goal. Holmes cut in to see his shot blocked, with follow-ups from Guest and Holmes again also suffering the same fate before another ball into the box reached Holmes whose attempt lacked sufficient power to really trouble Grant.

With news filtering through of scores elsewhere, the importance of a goal could not be underestimated but were those missed chances going to haunt the Peacocks? Thankfully not! Urged on by the travelling fans, the Peacocks notched the winner after 84 minutes. Hill flicked a pass to Adelsbury down the right and from his low driven cross Holmes was on hand to steer home from close range to spark joyous scenes.

The Peacocks navigated seven minutes of stoppage time without too much ado to secure a terrific win and their 5th League game without defeat, a result which lifts them up to second spot. Six games to go and Town's destiny is in their own hands!

We have a saying at NLP Towers, probably not too dissimilar to the thoughts of thousands of fans up and down the country each and every Saturday.

While the concept of Non-League Day must be embraced and celebrated, for us, every day is Non-League Day. We live and breathe it 365 days a year as I know you all do too.

So, even though last Saturday was 'just another day' at the office for us, for others it opened up the game at this level to a wider audience while players from the top two tiers of the English game were representing countries over their clubs. And what an introduction they had.

Back after a two-year Covid-forced absence, Non-League Day made a hardhitting return to the fixtures calendar with fans flocking in their droves to get a piece of the action.

None more so than at Notts County for the big game of the day where a stonking crowd of 10,334 witnessed their derby visit of promotion rivals Chesterfield, who themselves contributed 2,719 visiting fans to that gate.

At Step 2, a gate of 3,317 saw in-form York City take on Learnington – and turnstiles clicked furiously lower down the pyramid with Ilkeston Town attracting just short of 1,000 for their visit of Yaxley at Step 4.

Non-League Day, as we know, is renowned for its special events and celebrations - and this year's occasion didn't disappoint. South Shields' 1st Cloud Arena was the destination for Alex Scott and the BBC's Football Focus team as the cameras witnessed the celebration of the Mariners' visit of Stafford Rangers.

Those who stuck around after the match were able to watch England's friendly with Switzerland and even join in with a bit of karaoke!

Dover Athletic fans had a day to remember too. Those who made the long trip up to Wrexham were not only treated to free pies by their hosts, but also an 11-goal thriller with Jordan Davies' 98th-minute winner clinching a stupendous 6-5 victory for the home side.

Co-owner Ryan Reynolds should be used to such scripts as a Hollywood A-lister but even he tweeted that he had "lost nine years of his life" given the high-octane entertainment which saw his side hit back from 5-2 down against the alreadyrelegated Whites.


Aylesbury Vale Dynamos also allowed fans in for free if they donated an item of clothing to those affected by the war in Ukraine or KitAid Africa.

- 10. Persons must not damage, deface or obstruct any notice or advertisement.
- 11. Alcohol must not be brought into the stadium.
- 12. Persons must not consume alcohol that has not been purchased at Taunton Town FC.
- 13. Persons must not consume alcohol in any alcohol free designated areas.
- 14. There will be zero tolorance to alcohol abuse/misuse.
- 15. There will be zero tolorance to drug possession, use and abuse.
- 16. Smoking is permitted in the stadium except in areas designated as a No Smoking area.
- 17. Umbrellas are permitted within the stadium but must not be used if obstructing the view of other spectators.
