THE AWAY FND Famborough

Farnborough Football Club is the re-birth of Farnborough Town FC that was liquidated on 25 July 2007.

Farnborough Football Club started life in season 2007/08 in the Southern League Division One South & West and it was a season that turned to glory as the club won the Championship and with it promotion to the Southern League Premier Division. The League title was secured under manager Andy Clement with 89 points and an impressive 120 goals being scored in the process that underlined a fantastic achievement for the clubs new beginnings.

Despite the success, the club and Andy Clement mutually agreed that due to the extra demands in the next step up a change of manager would be made and former Crawley Town and Basingstoke Town manager Francis Vines took up the reigns in the summer of 2008, assisted by former Reading and Basingstoke Town midfielder Steve Richardson.

Farnborough's Cherrywood Road ground had a large face-lift and investment was being put into a number of areas under the leadership of former Chairman Simon Hollis and the Board of Directors.

Boro almost made it back-to-back promotions, just missing out in the BGB Southern Premier play-off final, losing 1-0 to Gloucester City. That came after Vines' men had led the way for six months of the campaign, before losing the title to Corby Town in the final game of the season.

In the summer of 2009, it was announced that Vines would not remain as

manager, with Steve King replacing him as first team boss. Justin Skinner also arrived as assistant manager, with both signing full-time deals. Season 2009-10 saw Farnborough go onto win the Southern League and with it promotion to the Blue Square South.

Season 2010-11 saw 'Boro for the second time in their short history follow up a Championship with a second place finish, and after accounting for Woking in a two legged play-off semi-final, fell again at the last hurdle, Ebbsfleet United winning promotion to the Blue Square Premier in front of a record Rushmoor Community Stadium crowd exceeding 4,000.

Steve King left the club in May 2011, replaced by former Hayes & Yeading manager Garry Haylock, and the club declared that it was transferring to full time status.

Following a poor run of results, Haylock's tenure as manager came to an end in November 2011, and his replacement came in the guise of Chertsey Town manager Spencer Day, and a return to part time football.

With the change of manager came an upturn of fortunes, and a run of six successive league wins spanning January through March pulled Boro away from the danger zone, although a five point deduction imposed by the Football Conference took the club back into trouble, but Blue Square South football was secured on the penultimate Saturday with a solitary goal victory over Havant & Waterlooville.

In 2012/13 the club enjoyed a relatively successful season on the pitch, playing a good brand of football but again were blighted by off field issues, a four point deduction was confirmed in January for the playing of an ineligible player due to International Clearance issues and was followed by the loss of a further ten points after the club entered administration on the eve of the final league match of the season, despite this the club still finished a creditable 14th place.

Season 2013/14 encountered early problems in that despite the club coming out of administration and entering a CVA there were a number of issues involving our membership of The Conference that needed to be resolved. positive side, the club was also boosted by a major sponsorship deal with well known bookmakers Paddy Power. Despite the initial difficulties Boro retained their status in the Football Conference South and finished the season in a respectable 16th position.

Historical financial debt problems continued to dog the club in season 2014/15 which remained under a CVA and this inevitably left the manager with no choice but to implement a reduced player budget. The consequences of this long term handicap finally came home to roost when Boro finished 20th in the Vanarama Conference South suffering relegation to the Ryman Premier.

The 2015/16 season didn't start much better. An application during the close season for Farnborough to vary the terms of it's CVA dragged on and wasn't settled until 5 weeks into the new season, too late to implement the 1 league drop punishment for such action. Instead we were placed in the impossible position that we would be relegated at the end of the season regardless, unless we finished in the bottom 4 in which case it would be a double relegation! Added to this we were again starting the season 5 weeks late having to play catchup. Despite an impressive 5-1 win at home to Lewes in our first game of the season, the very tight playing budget coupled with the knowledge we were being relegated meant the manager struggled to get in the right calibre of players and soon we found ourselves in a double relegation spot, where we remained for the majority of the season.

Off the field things were beginning to look a little brighter, thanks to the hard work of the owners, the CVA was paid off early and the club was debt free for the first time in many years! A final push in the last 10 matches of the season saw Farnborough turn their form around and 25 points out of a possible 30 saw us climb out of the relegation zone and finish 18th. So it was just the one league relegation punishment but a re-defining of the league's geographical borders also resulted in a sideways move to the Southern Central.

2016/17 season got off to a good start, with Farnborough briefly leading the charge before dropping back to the second position behind Royston Town. A season long chase ensued, waiting for Royston to slip up, a slip that never materialised, and the Boro had to settle for second place and home draw in the playoffs. The team stayed stable throughout the season, based on the successful late season squad from the previous year with a few local favourites in the guise of Nic Ciardini, Josh

Huggins and Perry Coles added. The start of the season saw us graced by the presence of former Norwich/Reading/Bristol Rovers star, Jamie Cureton, before he departed for higher level football at Eastleigh. On the coaching side, long time assistant coach, Leigh Dynan, left to pursue a manager's role at Whyteleafe, but Spencer wasted no time in bringing in Jon Reed whose knowledge of the Southern league proved to be invaluable.

A late season run by Egham Town saw them arrive at The Rushmoor Community Stadium as playoff semi final opponents but Farnborough were also a team in form, and having secured the services of Cureton again, along with former favourite, Scott Donnelly, were just too strong, coming out on top with a 4-0 winning scoreline.

Onto the playoff final, and in front of 1000 plus Boro supporters, the Yellows secured a nervous, but comfortable 2-0 victory over Barton Rovers to signify their return to the Southern Premier League.

The 2017/18 season started off in disaster when new recruits Connor Calcutt and Kieron Forbes both picked up serious injuries in our final pre-season match against Molesey Town. This hampered our progress and lead to some disappointing results. With the reorganisation of the leagues, and only 1 team being relegated, the board took the decision to reduce the playing budget around Christmas time and the yellows fielded a very young, but still very exciting team for the remainder of the season. Never in danger of relegation, Boro finished towards the lower end of the table. However, there were some great highlights along the way, most notably silencing the home crowd at eventual league winners, Hereford, beating them 1-0 and beating long time league leaders King's Lynn Town 5-2 at home against all expectations.

Season 2018/19 proved to be a year of consolidation. After a disastrous first half to the season and wholesale squad changes, Boro came good around the christmas mark and went on an unbeaten run resulting in the January team of the month award. For a while it looked like playoffs were a possibility but it was just a step too far and after a slight dip towards the end of the season, finished in a commendable 9th place in the league. Midfielder Kurtis Cumberbatch was ever present and picked up both the fan's player of the season and player's player awards, as well as top scoring.

Onto the eventful 2019/2020 season, the season that never was! An up and down season on many fronts.

An opening day loss to a fancied Poole Town was one of several lows, which included 0-7 and 0-5 home defeats to Tiverton and Wealdstone, the latter sending Boro crashing out of the FA cup. The passing of club stalwart, Chris Cook who lost his fight with cancer.

In contrast, several highs also, 4-0 home victories against Taunton, Yate and Hendon, and an impressive 1-3 away victory at Weston-super-Mare. The high flying Boro squad making their way to Truro, LHR to NQY return!

Alas it was all in vain, with the outbreak of the Covid 19 virus, the league was suspended in March and declared Null and Void.

With the outlook for season 2020/21 pretty bleak again due to the Covid 19 pandemic, Farnborough decided to "risk" a low budget approach for the start of the season, and it proved to be the correct decision when the season faltered after just 8 matches.

MEET THE APProved

Courtney "CJ" Fearn - A product of the Farnborough Youth Academy, CJ has a first class attitude and is eager to learn and progress in the game. A talented and hardworking defender/midfielder, was Young Player of the Season in 2013/14 and supporters' Player of the Season in 2014/15, 2015/16 and 2017/2018

Dante Baptiste - On a season-long loan from Premier League Watford, Dante impressed in pre-season despite his young years. Formerly of Norwich City, Baptiste joined Watford in July 2018 and was a regular in the U18s, before more recently progressing into the U23s. Boro's new custodian is familiar with Non-League, having experienced brief loan spells with Wingate & Finchley and Hendon where he saved four penalties in a shoot-out on one occasion.

Jack Turner - Started his career at youth level for Staines Town before moving on to AFC Wimbledon, where he progressed into the first team squad. He returned to Staines in 2012 to make over 200 appearances for the

Swans. In 2017, a move to Slough Town ensued where he remained for 4 seasons. Jack started season 2021/22 with Cray Wanderers before the switch to Farnborough in December.

Richard Orlu - Back for his second spell in Hampshire, having initially played for the Club during the 2012/13 season, Richard has a vast amount of National League experience, having performed for Dover Athletic, Woking, Welling United, Hampton & Richmond Borough and most recently Dulwich Hamlet.

John Oyenuga - A true fans favourite, the ever smiling John rejoined the yellows in 19/20, having departed for Welsh Premier League outfit, Connah's Quay Nomads in August 2017 A pacey right back, other former clubs include Walton and Hersham and Westfield.

Jack Ball - Jack joins the Boro for the second half of the season. Previous clubs include Salisbury, Hartley Wintney and Cove.

Mark Nisbet - Late season signing, Mark

has a wealth of experience and comes to Farnborough from National League South side, Slough Town, for whom he made 187 appearances. Previous to that, Mark spent 10 years at Maidenhead United, clocking up over 300 appearances.

Rob Howard - Rob joins Farnborough on loan from Southend United. He spent his youth career at Southend, Arsenal and Colchester, before returning to Southend. He's had loan spells at Harlow, Dartford. Braintree and King's Lynn, and made his Southend League 2 debut on season 20/21.

Louie Paget - Signing for Boro towards the end of 19/20 season from Neighbours, Hartley Wintney, Louie returns for season 21/22 ready to impress. A versatile player who can play at full-back or anywhere in midfield. The athletic youngster came through Hartley Wintney's youth team set-up and is their former U18 Captain, signing First Team forms in August 2015. Currently on dual registrarion at Leatherhead.

Ramarni Medford-Smith - Former Reading U18 and U23 defender, Ramarni made his Reading first team debut against Blackpool in January 2020, in an FA Cup tie. He also had loan spells at Torquay and Plainmoor. In September 2020, he departed Reading and joined Marlow town. He joins Boro as cover across the back 4, and scored his debut Boro goal away against Truro.

Frankie Sutherland - The Hillingdon born midfielder is a product of Queens Park Rangers' youth system, who spent time on loan with Portsmouth. AFC Wimbledon, Dagenham & Redbridge and Crawley Town. After being released by the West London Club in the Summer of 2016. Frankie went straight into Non-League and signed for National League Woking, before moving onto Whitehawk. The Republic of Ireland under 17.19 and 21 International joined National League Bromley at the start of the 2017/18 where he went on to make 74 appearances in two seasons, finding the net on 11 occasions. Frankie got a season under his belt in The National League South with Ebbsfleet United in 2019/20 followed by a spell with Billericay Town before his move to Farnborouah.

Mitch Brundle - Mitch joins Farnborough from Barnet having made 22 appearances for the National League outfit this season before his transfer in early February. Previous clubs include Dagenham & Redbridge, Dover, Gateshead and Braintree

Harry Cooksley - A product of Reading and QPR youth setups, Harry spent 2 seasons playing college soccer in the USA, before returning to the UK with Aldershot Town and AFC Wimbledon. He then had a spell with Mallorca B before making his Farnborough debut in 2019, making 12 appearances for the Yellows. 2019/20 saw Harry once again overseas with Pinzgau Saalfelden in the third tier of the Austrian league. He returns for his second Boro spell this season, and will be one to watch in the heart of the midfield. Currently on loan at Hartley Wintney.

Sam Deering - Joining Farnborough this season, following the expiration of his contract at full-time outfit Dagenham & Redbridge, the former England C International started his career with Oxford United in 2006 where he won the Conference Play-Off Final to achieve promotion to the Football League - before moving on to Barnet and Cheltenham Town. An intelligent playmaker with an eye for goal, Boro's new recruit boasts a wealth of Step 1 and 2 experience having recently turned out for Whitehawk. Ebbsfleet United and Billericay Town over the past few years.

Michael Fernandes - A product of the Conquest Football Academy in Middlesex, Michael is a talented young winger, and made his debut for Farnborough against Hitchin Town scoring two goals. Returning this season for a second spell, Michael has been plying his trade at Colchester United, where he signed first year pro papers.

Youel Emmanuel - From West London.

played for Northwood and Hendon at youth team level. Progressed to Chalfont St Peter and Corinthian Casuals. Now in his third season with Farnborough.

Reggie Young - Reggie returns for his third spell at the Club from National League South outfit Hemel Hempstead Town, where he bagged 7 assists in a 2020/21 season cut short. Comfortable on the left and right, Young is ready to add to his 58 appearances and 12 goals in a Boro' shirt from 2018/19 and 2019/20.

George Butler - Joining the first team squad this season, George is everpresent in the heart of midfield in Ben Murray's Farnborough Academy side that competes in the Tactic League T1 South. Before being enrolled into Farnborough Football Academy last year, the youngster played for Woking based Goldsworth Park Rangers from the U6 team all the way through to U16. He's worked hard and earned his right to train with the first team and compete for a place in matchday squads.

Selim Saied - Selim is an exciting second year Woking academy player who returns to the Boro squad following a brief spell at Slough Town. He comes back in on a youth loan until the end of the season.

Paul Hodges - The 28-year-old joins

from National League South side Slough Town, where he was in his second spell at Arbour Park. The Secondary School English teacher started off playing part-time with Abbey Rangers in the Combined Counties Division One, before helping Hartley Wintney rise up the Non-League pyramid. He then earned a move to Woking where he helped them gain promotion back to Non-League's top flight in the 2019/20 season and spent the majority of the next season experiencing National League football. A move to Slough Town followed in February 2020 before rejoining Woking during the COVID-hit 2020/21 season, returning to Slough Town this Summer. Hodges reunites with team-mates Louie Paget (Hartley Wintney), Richard Orlu and Reggie Young (both Woking).

Ricky Holmes - Usually deployed as a winger or striker, Ricky is well known throughout The Football League, predominantly for his time with Barnet, Portsmouth, Northampton Town, Charlton Athletic, Sheffield United and most recently Southend United. The experienced attacker has made around 300 appearances in the League's just outside of England's top flight, scoring well over 100 goals during that time.

Terrell Egbri - Terrell comes in on loan from Southend United. He joined the Shrimpers as a youth player in 2015 and has made appearances in league1, league 2 and the National League for the Essex outfit, scoring a total of three goals. He has also had a loan spell at Harlow Town, returning 7 goals from 27 appearances.

David Pratt - David boasts a wealth of experience throughout Non-League, having enjoyed spells at Chippenham Town (three occasions), Wealdstone, Bath City, Maidenhead United and Basingstoke Town after starting his career with Swindon Supermarine in 2006/07. A hard-working number nine who has always been prolific throughout his career.

Mitch Parker - Mitchell's early football career included spells as an 18 year-old at Tottenham Hotspur and Leicester City FC, before spending the 2013/14 season at Hayes and Yeading United. After playing in Portugal, he returned to the UK and signed for Hellenic League club Highmoor Ibis in 2015 (since renamed Reading City).

Elliot Buchanan - Elliot has a wealth of experience in the Non-League pyramid. He began his career with Stevenage Borough and moved on to enjoy spells with Hayes & Yeading United, Newport County, Bromley, Bishop's Stortford, Margate and Chelmsford City. He joined Staines Town in July 2017 and won the 'golden boot' in the Isthmian Premier, scoring 39 league goals.



Jay Foulston's fabulous free kick after just five minutes settled this cagey derby contest as the Peacocks took another giant stride towards claiming the Premier South title and the one automatic promotion slot on offer. The occasion overshadowed the game to a large extent, with Town never really capitalising on their great start while the hosts upped their game in the second half without overly troubling the solid Peacock defence.

Town showed two changes from their last outing against Yate six days earlier, with Jake Wannell stepping back in after missing the last three games while Jared Lewington swapped places with Toby Holmes. It was a carnival atmosphere at Ladysmead, with its largest crowd for 21 years of 1546 consisting of a substantial and vocal Peacocks contingent who appeared to easily make up more than half the attendance, and they


had early cause to celebrate with a goal five minutes in. Joe Guest was brought down just outside the box as he moved in from the left and Foulston curled a beauty around the wall and in off the underside of the crossbar

The visitors went on to dominate the opening quarter of the game as they pressed Tiverton back but were unable to carve out another clear chance. Gary Warren's back header was chased down by Gethyn Hill, but keeper Lewis Williams survived and then Austen Booth did well to divert Joe Budd's deep cross away from Wannell to concede a corner. Another flag kick saw Williams punch clear back to Foulston who drove wide while Wannell headed a further corner over the top. It wasn't until the 26th minute that the Yellows posted an effort on goal, Louis Morison finding Chris Shephard inside whose shot



A Shephard corner was cleared to Dan Hayfield who fired a volley just over the top to end the half. So far so good. The second half nearly began badly for the Peacocks when a free kick was played short by Morison to Lam, and his cross was met by Warren for Buse to touch onto the post for a corner. Another free kick was fed to Hayfield whose shot deflected for another corner as the home side started to increase their efforts. Holmes replaced Lewington with ten minutes of the half played and was close to making an immediate impact, latching onto a long ball and after getting the better of Warren was left with Williams to beat, the Tivvy keeper coming out on top as he blocked Holmes' prod with his leg. Hill then cut in from Lloyd James' lofted pass but had his shot easily held by Williams as the Town fans clamoured for a second goal.

Few might have thought Ross Stearn would reappear this season following his shoulder dislocation against Royston four weeks earlier but the midfield talisman confounded any such ideas when he replaced Budd after 66 minutes before another opening came Tiverton's way when Shephard's cross wasn't cleared, and it fell loose to Lam who fired the wrong (or right from the Peacocks' view) side of the post.

Tiverton utilised all three of their substitutes in the final 15 minutes or so but there was to be no grandstand finish as the Peacocks' uncanny knack of just doing enough to win games whilst not at their best continued. Stearn fired a strike wide, and Holmes was denied by Warren's block while Buse clawed away Hayfield's free kick from the left at the opposite end. Four minutes of stoppage time were safely negotiated to ensure Town remained top of the table by three points. The celebrations from players and fans alike at the end said it all and a nervy few days now await going into what could be one of the most momentous weekends in the club's history.
