WEYMOUTH

Founded in 1890, Weymouth FC play their games at the Bob Lucas Stadium, north of the town centre of Weymouth in Dorset. The Bob Lucas Stadium has been the home stadium since 1987, as the club relocated from the Rec. Originally named the Wessex Stadium, the Bob Lucas Stadium is named after the late Bob Lucas, who was the club's president up until his death in August 2010, aged 85.

Weymouth FC were relegated last season to the National League South following a twoyear spell in the National League. Weymouth achieved back-to-back promotions to the National League when they became Southern League champions in 2018-19 season and followed up with promotion from the National League South in 2019-20. Weymouth advanced through the play-offs and defeated Dartford on penalties to achieve promotion. Current Aldershot manager Mark Molesley was part of the double promotion achievement but departed for Southend United at the end of the 2019-20 season. In the 20-21 National League season, Weymouth achieved an 18th placed finish under new manager Brian Stock. However, last season despite a

decent start to the league, Weymouth sacked manager Brian Stock in January 2022 after a run of seven consecutive defeats. The Terras replaced Stock with Oxford City manager David Oldfield who couldn't quite turn fortunes around as the club were relegated to the National League South last season. Oldfield left the club by mutual consent on the 16th September.

Former Bracknell Town manager Bobby Wilkinson became the club's new manager last month and has overseen Weymouth's progression to the First Round Stage of the FA Cup so far this season, with wins over Winchester City, Welling United and Havant & Waterlooville and a draw at home against AFC Wimbledon in the First Round tie means they have earned the right to a replay at Plough Lane next Tuesday.

The main focus however for Weymouth this season must be to turn around their league form and attempt to overturn the 10 point differential to escape the relegation zone and there is plenty of time left in the season to do so and retain their Vanarama National League South status.

Harry Kyprianou

Blair has scored once so far, with a goal against Chelmsford City. He also spent time on loan at Salisbury during his spell at Eastleigh.



Organising a game of football, at any level, is no easy task.

From ground staff to safety officers, from stewards to caterers, these people - volunteers more often than not - play a vital role in the day-to-day running of a matchday to ensure a safe and welcoming environment for all those who click through the turnstiles.

But there is one thing that even these superheroes just can not control - the weather!

As I'm sure you are all well aware, temperatures this week plummeted to 12-year lows in some parts of the UK, putting all best-laid plans into jeopardy.

The now obligatory winter footage of groundsmen and women up and down the country braving the big freeze to sweep snow off the pitch swamped social media, while fans too leant a helping hand. At Macclesfield, for example, early morning pleas from the club to join in the clean-up operation and ensure their game with Ramsbottom United went ahead were answered by a large pool of their loyal fanbase and they certainly played their part in a 4-0 win.

But, unfortunately, these things don't always go quite to plan and when Jack Frost does decide to play havoc with the football calendar things can get, well, a little bit ice-cold.

Let's start with AFC Rushden & Diamonds, for example, after players, staff, officials and fans were left "furious" after their Southern League Premier Central match at Needham Market was called off just 40 minutes before kick-off, ensuring a wasted 174-mile round trip.

Later that evening, Needham Market said in a statement: "The football club would like to put on record it's sincere apologies to everyone connected to our opponents AFC Rushden & Diamonds, Needham Market players and staff, and supporters of both teams who arrived for the 1:00pm kick off.

"Upon the match officials arrival they carried out a pitch inspection but despite much deliberation they agreed to postpone the match at 12:15pm.

"No further comment will be made by the Football Club surrounding the issue."

And it wasn't just AFC Rushden & Diamonds left with a bitter pill to swallow. Hendon, too, were left aggrieved after travelling two-and-a-half hours to Yate Town - on a coach costing over

£1,000 - only for the game to be called off shortly after their arrival.

To make matters worse for the Greens, Yate's Lodge Road pitch had reportedly passed a 10am inspection carried out by the referee's assistant.



Furious Hendon boss Lee Allinson tweeted at the time: "Arrived at Yate, two-and-a-half hours on a coach, game off! Shambles, nowhere neat playable."

And it was the same also for Hendon's league rivals Winchester City, who suffered the same fate of a late postponement on their arrival at Poole Town's Black Gold Stadium.

Sadly, this is nothing new in Non-League football. While 90 per cent of postponements are announced in good time to prevent the visiting team from travelling unnecessarily, there will always be occasions where it's difficult to avoid.

I do feel, though, that in an era where we can send a man to the moon and launch the worldwide web then surely a protocol can be put in place to prevent this from continuously happening?

Safety of the players can never be compromised when it comes to frozen pitches - and if last-minute calls suggest that a pitch may be 50/50 playable, then I would argue that it's not.

But is there the slightest possibility that the Football Association and/or individual leagues, can sit down and devise a routine inspection system - taking into account the distance travelled by the visiting team - where calls must be made before a certain time by local officials to clear the situation of any such doubt?

No-one wants any frosty atmospheres at Christmas.

It was another Tuesday night trip to Slough for the Peacocks after the original Saturday trip was cancelled due to the playing surface at Arbour Park being deemed unsafe to play on. Taunton, playing in their claret and blue home strip, were the first to show which saw them take the lead, Jay Foulston's cross finding Joe Guest who turned just inside the box and calmly slotted his shot into the bottom left corner past Rhys Forster in the Slough Town goal after four minutes. The next notable chance would come from the home side's number 16, Sam Shaw, but Taunton's loanee goalkeeper, Jack Bycroft made the first of several huge saves to deny Slough the chance to get level while Alfonso Tenconi spurned a chance just before the break. The first half remained fairly even with both sides feeling slightly hard done by with a few decisions from the officials, but the Peacocks went into the break with the advantage following Guest's early goal.

The second half began and a Slough side, clearly frustrated at their lack of an equaliser, came out with some intent, repeatedly trying their luck with shots from outside the box. Not too many would test the Peacocks' keeper, but those that did were met with some strong saves that would end up earning Bycroft Taunton's Man of The Match award.

Around the 90 minute mark, the fourth official consulted with the referee to give his version of events after a Nat Jarvis tackle. Following this

conversation Jarvis was shown a red card,
Taunton's first of the season, while Connor SidleyAdams was also dismissed from Town's bench
after protesting about the decision. A spirited
Slough tried to break though the Taunton defence
during six plus minutes of additional time and
though they had chance after chance to do so,
the Peacocks held strong to the final whistle to
progress through to the final 32 of The Isuzu FA
Trophy to face Torquay United away in the next
round.

THE UNTOLD GAME

- The Disgrace of Gijon -

'We will dedicate our seventh goal to our wives, and the eighth to our dogs,' announced the West Germany side as they went into the 1982 World Cup. They had won the competition eight years previously, on home ground, and although hadn't made the same impact in Argentina, were hopeful of adding a third World Cup to their tally back on European soil. Jupp Derwall's side cruise through qualifying unbeaten, scoring 33 goals, and boasted some of the starts of the age, chief among them Karl-Heinz Rummeniage. The group contained nothing to fear: Chile, who had claimed the final South American qualification place, and a decent but lacking Austria side. First up, though, were first-time qualifiers and plucky upstarts from Africa. 'If we don't beat Algeria,' quipped Derwall to the press, 'we'll take the next train home.'

Algeria, though, were no untested minnows. The North African side were well drilled and played a quick passing game that was a match for anybody. Earlier in 1982 they had gone to the semi-finals of the African Nations Cup before losing to eventual winners Ghana, but they had their sights set on the biggest stage of all. They went into the World Cup hoping for a good showing, and maybe to pick up a win in their final game against Chile, which was expected to be meaningless.

It was unexpected, then, when Algeria proved quite the match for the Germans in the first half of their opening game. Quite apart from their pre-match predictions of

eight goal victories, their crisp passing of the African side had them on the back foot, and West Germany had to hold on until the break to go in goalless. Derwall got into his side at half time and demanded improvement, but it didn't help. On 54 minutes Rabah Madjer reacted to a Harald Schumacher save and fired home. Algeria's first World Cup goal. That spurred West Germany into life, and they reacted. On 67 minutes Rummenigge equalised from close range. But the complacency set in immediately, and right from kick off Algeria passed around the European side to restore their lead. This time they held on, and secured one of the biggest upsets in World Cup history.

West Germany kicked it up a gear in the second game of the tournament, beating Chile 4-1 to go level on points with Algeria, who lost a tighter than expected game (or perhaps not, after the first result) against Austria. The two European sides faced off in the final game, while Algeria needed to beat Chile to keep their hopes alive.

The Africans did just that, surviving a scare in their final game to win 3-2, but having to wait 24 hours for West Germany and Austria to play. With the benefit of hindsight, FIFA changed this arrangement so that the final group games are now played together, but that didn't help Algeria. Somebody worked out that a 1-0 West Germany win would see both them and Austria through, so that's what they ensured would happen.

The game had the atmosphere of a déad-

rubber, and it only got worse as time went on. Horst Hrubesch scored the goal that the West Germans needed on the tenth minute, and then both sides just... stopped. No more attacking, no more chances, just some very polite passing to see the game out. The spectacle got more farcical as time went on, until the final whistle. Algeria were out.

It's called the Scandal of Gijon in Algeria. For the final thirty minutes, one commentator told his viewers to turn their televisions off and refused to speak until the final whistle. Algeria cried foul, and FIFA did nothing. Germany fans bombarded the team hotel with water bombs out of shame. But Austria's representative Hans Tschak wasn't just unapologetic, he was downright outrageous. 'If 10,000 'son's of the desert'... want to trigger a scandal because of this is just shows they have too few schools' he said. 'Some Sheikh comes out of an oasis, is allowed to get a sniff of World Cup air after 300 years, and thinks he's entitled to open

his gob.' It was an embarrassing end to the group for all involved.

Algeria's appeal was rejected, without much explanation, but after the scandal at the 1978 World Cup, where Argentina had won 6-0 in their final group game because their rivals had played earlier, they did take the opportunity to change the format slightly. For forty years since that tournament, final group games are played at the same time to try to limit the advantage. West Germany went all the way to the final, but Algeria will always have been robbed by the Disgrace of Gijon.

CYGNET HEALTHCARE STADIUM REGULATIONS

Persons entering this stadium must abide by the Stadium Regulations as printed in the matchday programme and displayed on posters inside the stadium. Failure to do so may result in ejection from the premises, a ban from attending any future events and also be the subject of a football banning order. Admission to and the right remain within the stadium is strictly on condition that any person attending will adhere to the Stadium Regulations as detailed below.

- 1. All persons must comply with any directions given by a Steward, Club Official or Police
- 2. Encroachment onto the playing area, sterile area, or its adjoining parts is prohibited.
- 3. Climbing on any building, wall, fence or any other structure is prohibited.
- Persons must not throw any object onto the pitch or within the spectator areas.
